NOTICE Intention to Designate a Property / Ontario Heritage Act

The Council of the City of Markham intends to designate the following property for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990*, Chapter O.18, Part IV:

John and Jane Pingle House 10060 Kennedy Road Markham, ON

The John and Jane Pingle House has design and physical value as a representative example of a late nineteenth century vernacular farmhouse with Georgian architectural influences. The John and Jane Pingle House has historical and associative value, representing the locally-significant theme of immigration, particularly the Berczy settler families who arrived in Markham Township in 1794, and the nineteenth century trend whereby farmers would improve their farmsteads as they progressed past the early settlement phase. Further, the property has contextual value as one of a number of nineteenth century buildings located in the general vicinity of the historic community of Colty Corners, and is physically and historically linked to the former farm property where it has stood since c.1875.
