

NOTICE
Intention to Designate a Property / Ontario Heritage Act

The Council of the City of Markham intends to designate the following property for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990*, Chapter O.18, Part IV:

Pearse Bungalow
7484 Sixteenth Avenue
Markham, ON

The Pearse Bungalow has design and physical value as a representative example of a Craftsman Bungalow which displays the influence of the American Arts and Crafts Movement in its general form and character. Constructed in the mid-to-late 1930s, it is a late example of its style with restrained detailing. The Pearse Bungalow has historical value as it is associated with the maturation of Markham's agricultural community as it transitioned from the nineteenth century into the twentieth century and old farmsteads were updated with new buildings. Further, the property has contextual value for being physically, functionally, visually and historically linked to its surroundings, where it has stood since the latter half of the 1930s. The property is historically linked to the George and Catherine Miller House at 9318 Reesor Road, also located on Rigfoot Farm.
