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BY-LAW 2024-19

City of Markham Comprehensive Zoning By-law

WHEREAS it is considered desirable to prohibit the use of land and the erection and use of building or structures except for certain purposes, and to regulate the type of construction and the height, bulk, location, size, floor area, character and use of buildings in accordance with the provisions of Section 34 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13 as amended;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the City of Markham enacts as follows:

PART 1.0 INTERPRETATION AND ENFORCEMENT

1.1 APPLICABILITY

This By-law may be referred to as the "City of Markham Zoning By-law" and applies to the lands within the <u>City</u> shown on Schedule "A" below:

SCHEDULE 'A'

1.2 CONFORMITY AND COMPLIANCE WITH BY-LAW

No person shall change the <u>use</u> of any <u>building</u>, <u>structure</u> or land or erect or use any <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> to which this By-law applies or occupy any land, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> except in accordance with the provisions of this By-law.

1.3 INTERPRETATION

1.3.1 USE OF PLAIN LANGUAGE

This By-law is written in plain language with a deliberate attempt to keep the words, grammar and syntax as simple as possible while meeting the legal requirement for clear and precise language. The word "shall" is mandatory. The phrase "used for" includes "arranged for", "intended for", "maintained for", "designated for", or "occupied for". Unless otherwise specified in the By-law, words used in the singular include the plural, and words used in the plural include the singular. Words used in the present tense include the future tense, and words used in the future tense include the present tense as the context shall require.

1.3.2 NEED TO COMPLY WITH OTHER REQUIREMENTS

Nothing in this By-law shall relieve any person from any obligation to comply with the requirements of any other By-law, Act, or Legislation, of the <u>City</u> or any other requirement of the Regional Municipality of York, the Province of Ontario, the Government of Canada, or the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority, that may affect the <u>use</u> of lands, <u>building</u> or <u>structures</u> in the <u>City</u> to which the By-law, Act, or Legislation, applies.

1.3.3 REFERENCES TO PROVINCIAL ACTS

Where this By-law references a Provincial Act, or section in a Provincial Act, which is amended, repealed, or replaced, reference shall be made to include the new section, or any successor legislation, as applicable.

1.3.4 SEVERABILITY

A decision of a court or a tribunal that one or more of the provisions of this By-law are invalid in whole or in part does not affect the validity, effectiveness or enforceability of the other provisions or parts of the provisions of this By-law.

1.3.5 **DEFINITIONS**

a) All words within the body of any section, sub-section and table that are bolded are defined in Part 3.0 of this By-law.

- b) Each of the <u>uses</u> defined in <u>Part 3.0</u> of the By-law are distinct and separate from other defined <u>uses</u>, unless the definition indicates otherwise.
- c) Unless otherwise defined, the words and phrases used in this By-law are defined as per the Canadian Oxford Dictionary.

1.3.6 PERMITTED USES

- a) Where a <u>use</u> is defined in <u>Part 3.0</u> of this By-law and not specifically listed as a permitted <u>use</u> in a <u>zone</u>, the <u>use</u> as defined is not a permitted <u>use</u> in that <u>zone</u>.
- b) Unless specifically permitted in this By-law, all <u>uses</u> identified in this By-law, shall be conducted in a wholly enclosed <u>building</u>.

1.3.7 ILLUSTRATIONS

All illustrations in this By-law are not an operative part of this By-law. They are included only to assist as a visual aid to the reader with the interpretation of the By-law.

1.3.8 PURPOSE STATEMENTS

- a) Purpose statements are included in this By-law for each **zone** which are intended to assist in the understanding:
 - (i) of the zones objectives;
 - (ii) of the planning principles underlying the <u>use</u> provisions; and,
 - (iii) of the regulatory provisions of the **zone**.
- b) Purpose statements are also structured to reflect a prime objective of the By-law, which is to implement the land <u>use</u> related policies of the <u>Official Plan</u>. In this regard, each purpose statement contains three basic elements:
 - (i) The land <u>use</u> designation in the <u>Official Plan</u> that is being implemented;
 - (ii) The purpose of the land <u>use</u> designation; and,
 - (iii) A general overview of the permitted <u>uses</u> in the <u>zone</u>, the special <u>use</u> provisions that apply in the <u>zone</u> and the standards for that <u>zone</u>.

c) Purpose statements are included in this By-law for the convenience of the reader and are not an operative part of this By-law.

1.3.9 INTERPRETATION OF BY-LAW

Notwithstanding any of the above directions, the final interpretation of any aspect of this By-law is the responsibility of the Director of Building Standard and/or the Director of Planning and Urban Design or their designates.

1.4 ENFORCEMENT

Every person that contravenes any provision of this By-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to the fine(s) as provided in the Planning Act and, if the person is a corporation, every director or officer of the corporation who knowingly concurs in the contravention is guilty of an offence and on conviction is liable to the fine(s) as provided in the Planning Act. Where a conviction is entered under the Act, in addition to any other remedy or any penalty provided by By-law, the applicable court may make an order prohibiting the continuation or repetition of the offence by the person convicted. Penalties imposed by conviction under this Section shall be recoverable under the Provincial Offences Act.

1.5 REPEAL OF FORMER BY-LAWS

1.5.1 BY-LAWS TO BE REPEALED IN FULL OR IN PART

- a) All Zoning By-laws and associated amendments attached thereto, as identified in <u>Section 1.1 Schedule 'A'</u>, that are located within the geographical areas that are covered in this By-law, are superseded as they apply to those lands affected in this By-law.
- b) Upon this By-law becoming in full effect and in force on any lands, those By-laws and associated amendments attached thereto identified in <u>Section 1.1 Schedule 'A'</u> as they apply to those lands, shall be repealed.
- c) Notwithstanding a), all parts of those By-laws identified in Table 1.5.1 below, and identified as areas not covered in this By-law in Section 1.1 Schedule 'A', shall remain in full force and effect.

d) Where this By-law has come in full effect and in force on all of the lands affected by a By-law identified in Table 1.5.1, that By-law shall be repealed in its entirety.

1.6 PREVIOUS APPROVALS

1.6.1 MINOR VARIANCES TO FORMER BY-LAWS

- a) Where the Committee of Adjustment of the <u>City</u>, the Ontario Municipal Board, the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal or the Ontario Land Tribunal has authorized a minor variance from one or more of the By-laws listed in Section 1.5, the provisions of this By-law (as they apply to such land, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>) are modified to the extent necessary to only and solely give effect to the provisions of that previous minor variance that would otherwise not be in compliance with this By-law.
- b) Sub-section a) does not authorize any relief from this By-law unless the relief was specifically granted in the previous minor variance.

1.6.2 PREVIOUS DECISIONS FOR PERMISSION UNDER SECTION 45 (2) OF THE PLANNING ACT OR TO EXPAND LEGAL NON-CONFORMING USES

Where the Committee of Adjustment of the <u>City</u>, the Ontario Municipal Board, the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal or the Ontario Land Tribunal has made a decision in accordance with Sections 45(2)(a) or (b) of the <u>Planning Act</u>, respecting a <u>use</u> that was a legal <u>non-conforming use</u> under a By-law listed in <u>Section 1.5</u>, the provisions of this By-law (as they apply to such <u>use</u>, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>) are modified to the extent necessary

to implement the previous decision made before the effective date of this By-law.

1.6.3 SITE PLAN AND HERITAGE APPROVALS

Where site plan approval in accordance with the <u>Planning Act</u> or, a heritage permit in accordance with the <u>Heritage Act</u>, has been granted by the <u>City</u> before the effective date of this By-law and a <u>building</u> permit for the project has not been issued, the provisions of this By-law, (as they apply to such land, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>), are modified to the extent necessary to implement the previous site plan approval or heritage permit.

1.7 APPLICATIONS IN PROCESS

The provisions of this section are repealed three years after the effective date of this By-law.

1.7.1 BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS

Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the erection or <u>use</u> of a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> for which an application for a <u>building</u> permit or residential infill lot grading permit has been accepted, and the estimated fees have been paid in full, on or prior to the effective date of this By-law, if the project in question complies with the provisions of the applicable By-law as it read on the day before the effective date of this By-law.

1.7.2 ZONING PRELIMINARY REVIEW APPLICATIONS

Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the erection or <u>use</u> of a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> for which an application for a Zoning Preliminary Review application has been accepted, and the estimated fees have been paid in full, on or prior to the effective date of this By-law, if the project in question complies, with the provisions of the applicable By-law as it read on the day before the effective date of this By-law.

1.7.3 MINOR VARIANCE APPLICATIONS

The requirements of this By-law do not apply to prevent the erection or use of a building or structure for which an application for a minor

variance under Section 45 of the <u>Planning Act</u> was filed on or prior to the effective date of this By-law, provided the application was in compliance with the relevant By-law in <u>Section 1.5</u> that applies, except for those aspects of the previous By-law that are subject to the minor variance application.

1.7.4 SITE PLAN APPROVAL APPLICATIONS

The requirements of this By-law do not apply to prevent the erection or use of a building or structure for which an application for site plan approval under Section 41 of the Planning Act or a heritage permit in accordance with the Heritage Act, was filed and accepted by the City on or prior to the effective date of this By-law provided the application conforms to the relevant By-law listed in Section 1.5 before the effective date of this By-law.

1.8 NON-CONFORMING USES

- a) Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the <u>use</u> of any land, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> for any purpose prohibited in this By-law if such land, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> was lawfully used for such purpose on the effective date of this By-law, provided it continues to be used for that purpose.
- b) Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the erection of an accessory building or structure, deck, outdoor patio, chimney breast, venting or other component supporting the operation of the building, that is accessory to a legal non-conforming use, provided that such accessory building or structure, deck, outdoor patio, chimney breast, venting or other component supporting the operation of the building, that is accessory to a legal non-conforming use complies with all applicable provisions of this By-law.

1.9 NON-COMPLYING BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES

1.9.1 REPLACEMENT, ENLARGEMENT, REPAIR OR RENOVATION

 A <u>non-complying building</u> or <u>structure</u> that was legally erected or altered in accordance with a By-law or permitted by a variance to

a By-law that was in effect prior to the effective date of this By-law may be enlarged, or renovated provided that the enlargement or renovation:

- (i) Does not further encroach into a required <u>vard</u>;
- (ii) Does not increase the amount of <u>floor area</u> or volume in a required <u>yard</u>;
- (iii) Does not in any other way increase a situation of non-compliance;
- (iv) Does not result in the removal of the foundation or framing to the top plate of the above grade walls within a required yard;
- (v) Complies with all other applicable provisions of this By-law.
- (vi) Where an existing <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> is enlarged or altered, the number of additional required <u>parking spaces</u>, <u>electric vehicle parking spaces</u>, <u>loading spaces</u> and, <u>bicycle parking spaces</u>, shall be equal to the numeric difference, if positive, between the requirements of this By-law after the enlargement or <u>alteration</u>, and the requirements of this By-law prior to the enlargement or <u>alteration</u>;
- (vii) Where a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> undergoes a change of <u>use</u> which existed on the date of the passing of this By-law and which change requires additional <u>parking spaces</u>, <u>electric vehicle parking spaces</u>, <u>loading spaces</u> and, <u>bicycle parking spaces</u>, the number of additional required spaces shall be equal to the numeric difference, if positive, between requirements of this By-law after the change of <u>use</u>, and the requirements of this By-law prior to the change of <u>use</u>; and,
- (viii) Notwithstanding <u>Sections 5.7</u> and <u>5.9</u> of this By-law, the requirement for additional required <u>parking spaces</u>, <u>electric vehicle parking spaces</u>, <u>loading spaces</u> and, <u>bicycle parking spaces</u>, shall only apply to the area of <u>alteration</u>, enlargement or change of <u>use</u>.
- b) Nothing in this By-law prevents the repair, strengthening or restoration to a safe condition of any legal <u>non-complying</u> <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> or part thereof provided that the dimensions of the original <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> or of any <u>yards</u> associated

with the <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> are not altered in any way except in conformity with this By-law.

- c) Nothing in this By-law prevents the replacement or rebuilding of all or a portion of a legal <u>non-complying building</u> or <u>structure</u>, provided that:
 - (i) The <u>use</u> that exists or is proposed is permitted by the By-law; and,
 - (ii) The dimensions, volume and location of the original building or structure or of any yards associated with the building or structure are not altered in any way.

1.9.2 NON-COMPLIANCE AS A RESULT OF LAND ACQUISITION BY A PUBLIC AUTHORITY

Notwithstanding any other provision in this By-law, if land is acquired by the <u>City</u>, the Regional Municipality of York, the Province of Ontario, the Government of Canada or any department, board, commission or agency thereof, and the acquisition results in a contravention of this By-law, the following applies:

- a) If the acquisition results in a contravention of this By-law with respect to minimum <u>lot frontage</u>, <u>lot depth</u>, and <u>lot area</u> requirements, the remaining <u>lot frontage</u>, <u>lot depth</u>, and, or, <u>lot area</u> shall be deemed to comply.
- b) If the acquisition results in a contravention to this By-law relating to required <u>yards</u>, <u>setbacks</u>, or <u>lot coverages</u>, the lands so affected are deemed to comply with this By-law to the extent it complied with this By-law on the day before the acquisition was finalized.
- c) Notwithstanding subsection b), no new <u>building</u>, <u>structure</u> or addition to an existing <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> shall be erected or located except in accordance with all the provisions of this By-law, excluding sub-section a).
- d) Notwithstanding any other provision in this By-law, where as a result of the establishment of a new <u>street</u> abutting a <u>lot</u> that would have been considered an <u>interior</u> lot prior to the

establishment of the <u>street</u>, such <u>lot</u> shall continue to be considered an <u>interior lot</u> for the purposes of determining compliance with this By-law.

1.9.3 NON-COMPLYING LOTS

A <u>lot</u> in existence prior to the effective date of this By-law that does not meet the <u>lot area</u>, <u>lot depth</u>, and, or, <u>lot frontage</u> requirements of the applicable <u>zone</u>, is permitted to be used and <u>buildings</u> and <u>structures</u> on the <u>lot</u> may be erected, enlarged, repaired, renovated, or replaced provided the <u>use</u> conforms with the By-law and the <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u> comply with all of the other provisions of this By-law.

1.10 TECHNICAL REVISIONS TO THE ZONING BY-LAW

Provided that the purpose, effect, intent, meaning and substance of this By-law are in no way affected, the following technical revisions to this By-law are permitted without a Zoning By-law Amendment:

- a) Changes to the numbering, cross-referencing, format and arrangement of the text, tables, schedules and maps;
- Additions to and revisions of technical information on maps and schedules including, but not limited to: topographic information; notes; legends; shading; and, title blocks;
- c) Alterations in punctuation or language; and,
- d) Correction of grammatical, dimensional, boundary, mathematical or typographic errors.

1.11 LAND OWNERSHIP

The <u>City</u> makes no representation or implication, nor should any inference be drawn from the schedules attached to this By-law as to the ownership of any land and, or, rights of access to such land. Ownership and access rights are legal matters that fall solely within the purview of a Court of competent jurisdiction.

2.3 ZONE SCHEDULES

- a) The <u>zones</u> and <u>zone</u> boundaries are shown on the following schedules that form part of this By-law:
 - (i) A6 and A7;
 - (ii) B6 and B7;
 - (iii) C2/1 to C7;
 - (iv) D2/1 to D7;
 - (v) E2/1 to E7;
 - (vi) F2/1 to F7;
 - (vii) G2/1 to G7;
 - (vii) H2/1 to H7;
 - (ix) J2/1 to J7;
 - (x) K2/1 to K5; and,
 - (xi) KL6 and KL7.
- b) For the convenience of the user, a single unofficial electronic consolidation of the schedules listed in subsection a) has been prepared and is available on the City's website or by clicking here: Interactive Zoning Map
- c) The paper copy of this By-law retained at the <u>City's</u> Clerk's Department is the legal version.

2.4 DETERMINING ZONE BOUNDARIES

When determining the boundary of any **zone** as shown on any schedule forming part of this By-law, the following provisions shall apply:

- a) Where a zone boundary is indicated as following a street, or lane, unopened road allowance, railway right-of-way or utility corridor, the zone boundary shall be the lot line abutting such a street, or lane, unopened road allowance, railway right-of-way or utility corridor.
- b) Where a <u>zone</u> boundary is indicated as substantially following <u>lot</u> <u>lines</u> shown on a Registered Plan of Subdivision or <u>lots</u> registered in a registry office or land titles office, the <u>zone</u> boundary shall be the same as such <u>lot lines</u>. If the location of a <u>lot line</u> changes in

accordance with <u>Section 1.9.2</u> of this By-law, the location of the <u>zone</u> boundary also changes to correspond with the new <u>lot line</u> location.

- c) Where the flooding hazard limit established by the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority extends outside the Greenway One or Greenway Two zones, the applicable Greenway zone applies, except where located in a Special Policy Area as outlined in Part 13.
- d) Where none of the above provisions apply, the <u>zone</u> boundary shall be scaled from the <u>City's</u> Geographic Information System-based Zone Boundary Feature Class.
- e) The limits of the Greenway One, Countryside Hold One (H1) and Greenway Two zones reflect the most accurate information available. The delineation of these zones are to be confirmed, refined or modified through the review of an area or site specific Zoning By-law Amendment, hold removal, or minor variance approval under the Planning Act supported by appropriate environmental studies and in accordance with the Official Plan.

2.5 MULTIPLE ZONES ON A LOT

- a) Where a <u>lot</u> falls into two or more <u>zones</u>, each portion of the <u>lot</u> shall be used in accordance with the provisions of this By-law for the applicable <u>zone</u>.
- b) Accessory buildings or structures shall be located in the same zone as the main building.
- c) In no case is a **zone** boundary dividing a **lot** into two or more **zone** categories intended to function as a property boundary for the purposes of calculating **yards** and **setbacks**. In all cases, the **lot line** shall be used for the purposes of calculating **yards** and **setbacks**, unless otherwise specified in this By-law.

2.6 EXCEPTION ZONES

- a) Where the letter (X) followed by a number within a set of brackets follows a **zone** symbol on the attached schedules to this By-law, the number refers to a site-specific exception that applies to the lands noted. Site-specific exceptions are listed in Part 14 of this By-law.
- b) The provisions of the site-specific exception govern over any inconsistent provisions in this By-law.

2.7 TEMPORARY USES

- a) Where the letter (T) is followed by a number within a set of brackets following a zone symbol on the attached schedules to this By-law, the lands affected are subject to a temporary use by-law in accordance with Section 39 of the Planning Act. Temporary use by-laws and the date that they expire are listed in Part 15 of this By-law.
- b) Upon the expiry of a temporary use by-law, the <u>use</u> of the land, <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u> for the purposes temporarily authorized shall cease.

2.8 HOLDING PROVISIONS

- a) Notwithstanding any other provision in this By-law, where the letter (H) followed by a number within a set of brackets follows a **zone** symbol, the lands affected are subject to a Hold provision in accordance with Section 36 of the Planning Act.
- b) No person shall use the land to which the letter (H) applies for any use other than the use which legally existed on the date the By-law applying the Holding provision came into effect, or expand or replace an existing building or structure, until the (H) is removed in accordance with the policies of the Official Plan and the criteria or reasons for removal of the (H) have been satisfied.

- c) Notwithstanding the above, this provision does not apply to **public uses** in accordance with <u>Section 4.6</u> a) of this By-law and other <u>uses</u> as per <u>Section 4.6</u> d) of this By-law, which are permitted without the need to remove the Holding provision.
- d) The existence of the Holding provision does not prevent the issuance of a building permit to make structural repairs, carry out façade improvements, improve and, or replace mechanical systems and, or replace openings.
- e) The existence of the holding provision does not prevent the carrying out of shoring and excavation, or the development of underground <u>parking garages</u>, except where the holding provision is applied to the following <u>zones</u>:

i)	GWY1	Greenway One

iii)	GWY3	Greenway Three
iv)	CTS	Countryside
v)	FD	Future Development

f) Holding provisions are listed in <u>Part 16</u> of this By-law.

PART 3.0 DEFINITIONS

<u>Accessory Building or Structure</u> means a detached <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>, the <u>use</u> of which is incidental to, subordinate to and exclusively devoted to the <u>principal use</u> in the <u>main building</u> located on the same <u>lot</u>.

<u>Accessory Industrial Equipment</u> means any equipment accessory and subordinate to a permitted <u>industrial use</u> or manufacturing process which is necessary to the normal, proper and safe function of that <u>use</u> or process such as a storage vessel, tower, stack, vent, duct, waste handling or conveyer system and any supportive <u>structure</u> thereof and may include a protective and, or, decorative enclosure of such equipment.

Accessory Use means a use of land, buildings or structures that are incidental to, subordinate to and exclusively devoted to the principal use located on the same lot.

<u>Adult Entertainment Establishment</u> means an establishment used for entertainment including activities, facilities, performances, exhibitions, viewings or encounters designed to appeal to erotic or sexual appetites or inclinations which a principal feature or characteristic is the nudity or partial nudity of any person.

Agricultural Use means the growing of crops, including nursery, biomass, sod farming, and horticultural crops; raising of livestock; raising of other animals for food, fur or fibre, including poultry and fish; aquaculture; apiaries; agroforestry; maple syrup production; and associated on-farm buildings and structures, including, but not limited to livestock facilities, and manure storage. Agricultural use shall not include a cannabis outdoor cultivation establishment or cannabis establishment, an abattoir or, the processing of farm related goods.

Agriculture-Related Uses means those farm-related commercial and farm-related industrial uses that are directly related to farm operations in the area, support agriculture, benefit from being in close proximity to farm operations, and provide direct products and, or, services to farm operations as a primary activity. Examples of agriculture-related uses include farmers markets, wineries, processing and storage of produce grown in the area and farm equipment repair.

<u>Alteration</u> means any modification to a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> that results in a change of <u>use</u>, or any increase or decrease in the volume or <u>floor area</u> of a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>.

<u>Amenity Area</u> means indoor or outdoor space on a <u>lot</u> that is designed for and available for use by the occupants of a <u>building</u> on the <u>lot</u> for recreational or social activities.

Angular Plane means an imaginary line that originates from the lowest grade of a lot line

or <u>zone</u> boundary and inclines at an angle identified in the applicable <u>zone</u> category, across the entire subject <u>lot</u>. No portion of a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> shall project above the <u>angular plane</u> identified in the <u>zone</u> category.

<u>Art Gallery</u> means an establishment used for the preservation, exhibition and, or, sale of paintings or other works of art.

Artist studio means an establishment used for one or more artists for the creation of art or crafts, and may include an accessory **commercial school** or an accessory **art gallery**.

<u>Arterial Road</u> means a <u>street</u> owned, operated, managed or maintained by the <u>City</u>, City of Toronto, or the Regional Municipality of York, as shown on <u>Map 10</u> of the <u>Official Plan</u>.

<u>Asphalt Plant</u> means an establishment that produces and, or, recycles asphalt or similar coated road stone and has equipment designed to heat and dry aggregate and to mix mineral aggregate with bitumen and, or, tar, and includes as <u>accessory uses</u>:

- a) The stockpiling, recycling and storage of bulk materials used in the process or finished product(s) manufactured on the <u>premises</u>; and,
- b) The storage and maintenance of equipment, and facilities for the administration or management of the business.

Average Grade Level means the average of the topography at the corner of all exterior walls, or in the case of a curved wall, at the tangent of the wall.

<u>Balcony</u> means a covered or uncovered platform that projects from the <u>main wall</u> of a <u>building</u> above <u>average grade level</u>. A <u>balcony</u> may be cantilevered, or may have structural supports from grade, but is not accessed by stairs from the outside.

<u>Banquet Hall</u> means an establishment for the purpose of catering to special events such as weddings, receptions or similar functions for which food and beverages are prepared and, or served exclusively to a private group and not to the general public.

<u>Barrier-free</u> means when applied to a <u>building</u> and its facilities, that the <u>building</u> and its facilities can be approached, entered and used by persons with physical, or sensory disabilities in accordance with the <u>Ontario Building Code</u>, the <u>Ontario Human Rights</u> <u>Code</u> and the <u>Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act</u>.

Basement means that portion of a **building** below the **first storey**.

<u>Bay Window</u> means a window or a combination of windows that project from the outer wall of a <u>building</u> that is not supported by a foundation wall.

Bed and Breakfast Establishment means an establishment that provides sleeping accommodation (including breakfast and other meals, services, facilities and amenities for the exclusive use of guests) to the public, in up to three guest rooms within a **detached dwelling** that is the principal residence of the proprietor of the establishment.

<u>Bicycle Parking Space</u> means an area that is provided and maintained for the purpose of temporary storage of a bicycle or motor assisted bicycle as defined under the <u>Highway Traffic Act</u>.

<u>Bicycle Parking Space, Long-term</u> means a <u>bicycle parking space</u> within a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> designed for the storage of Bicycles equipped with a rack or stand designed to lock the wheel and frame of a bicycle, or within a locked room for the exclusive use of parking bicycles.

<u>Bicycle Parking Space, Short-term</u> means a <u>bicycle parking space</u> that is equipped with a rack or stand designed to lock the wheel and frame of a bicycle, that is available for use by the general public.

<u>Body Rub Establishment</u> means an establishment where services involving the kneading, manipulation, rubbing, massaging, touching or stimulating by any means a person's body for the purposes of appealing to erotic or sexual appetites or inclinations.

<u>Breezeway</u> means a covered and unenclosed <u>structure</u> with no <u>basement</u> that connects a detached <u>accessory building or structure</u> and the <u>main building</u> on the <u>lot</u> and which is designed and used as a walkway between <u>buildings</u> and not used for any other purpose. A <u>breezeway</u> is not deemed to be part of the <u>main building</u> on a <u>lot</u>.

Brewery, Craft means a brewery, winery, or distilling establishment where the fermentation or distillation of grains, fruits or other agricultural products is carried out, and which alcoholic beverages may be packaged and sold for distribution, retail, or wholesale. The establishment may include tours, hospitality and tasting areas, by-the-glass sales, but shall not include a restaurant or tied house.

<u>Brewery, Retail</u> means an establishment that provides the location, material and equipment with which to make fermented or distilled beverages for a person's personal use. A <u>retail brewery</u> shall not include accessory <u>restaurants</u> or <u>retail stores</u> selling fermented or distilled beverages.

<u>Building</u> means a <u>structure</u> consisting of any combination of a wall, roof and floor, or a structural system serving the function thereof, including all associated works, fixtures and service systems.

<u>Building Facade</u> means the width of the <u>main building</u> facing a <u>street</u>, <u>lane</u>, or <u>private street</u> with the width measured from the exterior faces of the exterior walls. Where the facade of a <u>building</u> includes horizontal or vertical indentations, a <u>building facade</u> shall be considered continuous provided the indentation of the facade is less than 7.0 metres.

Business Office means an establishment used for conducting the affairs of businesses, professions, services, industries, governments, or like activities, in which the chief product of labour is the processing and, or storage of information rather than the production and distribution of goods. For the purpose of this By-law a business office may include, but is not limited to, a medical office, financial institution, and a motor vehicle rental office.

<u>Cannabis Establishment</u> means a <u>use</u> where the production, cultivation, processing, research, or analytical testing, of cannabis is carried out in a wholly enclosed <u>building</u>, subject to regulations under the Federal <u>Cannabis Act</u> and the <u>Food and Drugs Act</u>, as amended.

<u>Cannabis Outdoor Cultivation Establishment</u> means the growing of cannabis in an open air setting, for medical or recreational purposes, subject to regulations under the Federal <u>Cannabis Act</u> and the <u>Food and Drugs Act</u>, as amended.

<u>Carport</u> means a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> that is not wholly enclosed, that is used (or intended to be used) for the parking or storage of one or more <u>motor vehicles</u>.

<u>Car-share Parking Space</u> means a <u>parking space</u> exclusively reserved and used only for car-share purposes whereby the <u>motor vehicle</u> is accessible to at least the occupants of a <u>building</u>.

<u>Casino</u> means an establishment where patrons participate in any wagering, betting or gambling activity played with cards, dice, equipment, the use of communications technology, any mechanical, or electronic device or machine.

<u>Cemetery</u> means land used for the interment of human remains, and which may include scattering grounds, burial grounds, a <u>crematorium</u>, a <u>columbarium</u> and a <u>mausoleum</u> and as set out in the <u>Funeral</u>, <u>Burial and Cremation Services Act</u>. A <u>cemetery</u> may also

include office buildings accessory to the principal use.

<u>Child Care Centre</u> means an establishment operated by a person that is licensed in accordance with the <u>Child Care and Early Years Act</u>.

<u>City</u> means The Corporation of the <u>City</u> of Markham and where the context so implies, includes its <u>Council</u>, employees, solicitors, officers and agents.

<u>Columbarium</u> means a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> used for the interment of cremated human remains in sealed compartments.

<u>Commercial Parking Lot or Garage</u> means an area of land or a <u>building</u> or part of a <u>building</u> used for the parking of <u>motor vehicles</u> for a fee.

<u>Commercial Storage Facility</u> means an establishment used for the temporary storage of items in secured indoor areas or lockers.

<u>Community Centre</u> means a <u>building</u> or part of a <u>building</u> that is owned and, or, operated by a <u>public authority</u> or a <u>non-profit organization</u> that provides social, recreational or other similar facilities for use by the general public.

<u>Community Garden</u> means an area of land, rooftop, or other space managed and maintained by individuals and, or, <u>non-profit organizations</u> that is not located in a <u>building</u>, to grow and harvest:

- a) Food crops; or,
- b) Non-food, ornamental crops, such as flowers grown for personal or group use, consumption or donation.

A community garden shall not include a cannabis outdoor cultivation establishment.

<u>Concrete Batching Plant</u> means an establishment where concrete or concrete products used in <u>building</u> or construction is produced, and includes as <u>accessory uses</u>:

- a) The stockpiling, recycling and storage of bulk materials used in the process or finished product(s) manufactured on the <u>premises</u>; and,
- b) The storage and maintenance of equipment, and facilities for the administration or management of the business.

<u>Conservation Use</u> means an area of land that is generally left in its natural state and which is used for any combination of preservation, protection, or improvement of components of the natural heritage system and which may include, as an <u>accessory use</u>, passive recreational <u>uses</u> (such as hiking trails and cross country ski trails), and <u>buildings</u> and <u>structures</u> (such as nature interpretation centres and public information centres).

Council means the Council of the Corporation of the **City** of Markham.

<u>Crematorium</u> means a <u>building</u> that is fitted with appliances for the purpose of cremating human remains, and includes everything necessarily incidental and ancillary to that purpose, and has been approved or established as a <u>crematorium</u> in accordance with the requirements of the Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act.

<u>Dead End Parking Space</u> means a <u>parking space</u> which is abutting a <u>parking aisle</u> that only has one point of access.

<u>Deep Waste Collection Receptacle</u> means a container used for the temporary storage of garbage, rubbish, refuse, recyclable or compostable materials which is partially buried below grade.

<u>Day Camp</u> means a non-residential facility, intended to accommodate primarily outdoor recreational and educational activities for children but not providing for overnight accommodation or camping.

<u>Deck</u> means an uncovered and unenclosed <u>structure</u> that is accessory to a residential <u>use</u> and used as an outdoor <u>amenity area</u>, with a foundation holding it erect and a floor which is above finished grade, provides direct access to grade, and may include a landing or a stair.

Dormer means a roofed **structure** often containing a window, set vertically that projects from a sloped roof.

Dormitory means a **building** or part of a **building** that provides residential living accommodations for people attending a **college**, **university**, **private school**, or camp. A **dormitory** may include an accessory communal lounge, cooking, eating, sanitary and laundry facilities. A **dormitory** shall not include a **hotel** or **student residence**.

<u>Drive Aisle</u> means a defined area providing access for <u>motor vehicles</u> from a <u>street</u>, <u>provincial highway</u>, a <u>private street</u> or a <u>lane</u> to a <u>parking aisle</u>. A <u>drive aisle</u> does not directly abut a <u>parking space</u> or <u>loading space</u>.

<u>Drive-Through Service Establishment</u> means the <u>use</u> of land, <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u>, or parts thereof including <u>stacking spaces</u>, to provide or dispense products or services, either wholly or in part, through an attendant at a window or an automated machine, to customers remaining in <u>motor vehicles</u>. <u>Drive-through service establishments</u> are an <u>accessory use</u> to a permitted <u>use</u>.

<u>Driveway</u> means a defined stable surface that provides access for <u>motor vehicles</u> from a <u>street</u>, a <u>private street</u> or a <u>lane</u> to a <u>private garage</u>, <u>carport</u>, <u>parking pad</u> or <u>parking space</u> on a <u>lot</u> containing residential <u>uses</u>.

Dwellings regulated in this By-law are defined as follows:

- a) Apartment Dwelling means a <u>dwelling unit</u> in a <u>building</u> containing seven or more <u>dwelling units</u> that share a common external access to the outside through a common entrance and, or, a common corridor system, in which the <u>dwelling units</u> are arranged in any horizontal or vertical configuration.
- b) <u>Coach House</u> means a <u>dwelling unit</u> where the majority of the unit is located above a detached <u>private garage</u> in the <u>rear yard</u> of a <u>lot</u> that is accessed by a <u>lane</u>, and which is accessory to the <u>principal use dwelling unit</u> on the same <u>lot</u>.
- c) <u>Detached Dwelling</u> means a <u>dwelling unit</u> in a <u>building</u> containing only one <u>dwelling unit</u>.
- d) <u>Dwelling Unit</u> means a unit consisting of one or more rooms, which contains cooking, eating, living and sanitary facilities and is not a <u>rooming house large</u> <u>scale</u> or <u>rooming house small scale</u>. A <u>recreational motor vehicle</u> is not permitted to be used as a <u>dwelling unit</u> unless otherwise specified in this By-law.
- e) Garden Home means a dwelling unit located within an accessory building or structure in the rear yard of a lot that is not accessed by a lane and which is accessory to the principal use dwelling unit on the same lot.
- f) Garden Suite means a temporary dwelling unit regulated under the Planning Act that is accessory to the principal use dwelling unit on the same lot and which is designed to be portable. For the purposes of this definition, a garden suite may include a dwelling unit in a recreational motor vehicle.
- g) <u>Multiple Dwelling</u> means a <u>dwelling unit</u> in a <u>building</u> containing seven or more <u>dwelling units</u> that would not be considered as any other type of <u>dwelling unit</u> as

defined in this By-law.

- h) <u>Multiplex Dwelling</u> means a <u>dwelling unit</u> in a <u>building</u> containing four to six <u>dwelling units</u>, each with an entrance that is independent or through a shared landing and, or, external stairwell.
- i) <u>Semi-Detached Dwelling</u> means a <u>dwelling unit</u> in a <u>building</u> that is divided vertically into two <u>dwelling units</u> that share a common wall above grade.
- j) Townhouse Dwelling, Back to Back means a dwelling unit in a building that is vertically divided above grade into a minimum of four dwelling units, each of which has an independent entrance to the outside to the front of the building, and shares a rear wall. A maximum of two dwelling units within a back to back townhouse dwelling are permitted without sharing a common rear wall.
- k) <u>Townhouse Dwelling</u> means a <u>dwelling unit</u> in a <u>building</u> that is vertically divided above grade into a minimum of three <u>dwelling units</u>, each of which has an independent entrance to the outside to the front and rear of the <u>building</u>.

<u>Electric Vehicle</u> means a battery <u>electric vehicle</u> that runs only on a battery and an electric drivetrain, or a plug-in hybrid <u>electric vehicle</u> that runs on a battery and an electric drivetrain, and also uses an internal combustion engine.

<u>Electric Vehicle Level 2 Charging Ready</u> means a connected point in an electrical wiring installation at which Level 2 charging service can be taken to supply utilization equipment in accordance with the Ontario Electrical Safety Code.

<u>Electric Vehicle Charging Station</u> means a publicly or privately owned <u>parking space</u> that provides a minimum of Level 2 charging power transfer and information exchange between a branch electric circuit and an <u>electric vehicle</u> and in accordance with the <u>Ontario Electrical Safety Code</u>.

<u>Entertainment Centre, Major Regional</u> means an establishment used for social or amusement purposes and may include, but is not limited to, motion picture or live theatre establishments, concert halls, auditoriums, <u>nightclubs</u>, sports stadiums, go kart facilities, firearms ranges, but shall not include an <u>adult entertainment establishment</u>.

<u>Entertainment Centre, Minor Local</u> means an establishment used for social or amusement purposes and may include, but is not limited to, an arcade, gaming café, pool hall, virtual reality games, escape room, or karaoke facilities, but shall not include an

adult entertainment establishment or nightclub.

<u>Essential Emergency Service</u> means services which would be impaired during an emergency as a result of flooding, the failure of flood proofing measures and, or, protection works, and, or, erosion and includes <u>uses</u> such as police and fire stations and ambulance dispatch.

<u>Established Building Line</u> means a line that is the average distance between the <u>front lot line</u> and the nearest wall (including the <u>private garage</u>) of the <u>main building</u> facing the <u>front lot line</u> on the two <u>neighbouring lots</u> fronting the same <u>street</u>.

<u>Established Grade</u> means the level of the ground that is measured by averaging the grade located at two points that are 0.1 metres beyond the two side <u>lot lines</u> at a distance from the <u>front lot line</u> that is equal to the minimum <u>front yard setback</u>.

<u>Farm Labour Residence</u> means a <u>dwelling unit</u>, <u>multiple dwelling</u>, a camp containing temporary or mobile <u>dwelling units</u> or, other forms of shared housing which provides accommodations for employees of an <u>agricultural use</u> located on the same <u>lot</u>.

<u>Farm Vacation Home</u> means an establishment located on a farm that is the principal residence of the proprietor of the establishment. A <u>farm vacation home</u> provides sleeping accommodations and may include the participation in farm activities, meals, services, facilities and amenities for the exclusive use of guests in up to three guest rooms within a <u>detached dwelling</u>.

<u>Film Studio</u> means an establishment where live action or animated videos are filmed, produced or edited.

<u>Financial Institution</u> means an establishment in which financial services are offered to the public and includes a bank, credit union, trust company, savings office or any other retail banking operation.

<u>First Storey</u> means the <u>storey</u> with its floor closest to <u>average grade level</u> and having its ceiling more than 1.8 metres above grade.

Fitness Centre, Recreational means a <u>use</u> of land, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> that has been designated and equipped for the conduct of physical fitness and athletic activities and may include, but is not limited to, gymnasiums, indoor sports fields or arenas, yoga or pilates facilities, <u>swimming pools</u>, bowling alleys, skate or bicycle parks, rock climbing facilities, paintball facilities, and laser tag or indoor playgrounds. <u>Recreational Fitness</u>

<u>Centres</u> may also provide instructional classes in dance, martial arts, and other similar physical fitness activities, including a <u>studio fitness centre</u>.

<u>Fitness Centre, Studio</u> means an establishment in which facilities are provided for fitness or athletic activities and may include, but is not limited to, fitness training, exercise classes and other similar <u>uses</u> associated with physical rehabilitation and instructional classes in dance, martial arts, yoga or pilates and other similar physical fitness activities.

Floor Area means as set out below:

- a) Gross Floor Area means the aggregate of the areas of each floor of a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> above or below grade, measured between the exterior faces of the exterior walls of the <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>, or where there are common walls between <u>uses</u> or <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u>; measured to the centre-line of a common wall. The calculation of <u>gross floor area</u> excludes the areas of each floor used, or designed or intended for the parking of <u>motor vehicles</u>, unless the parking of <u>motor vehicles</u> is the <u>principal use</u> of a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>.
- b) Gross Leasable Floor Area means the total floor area designed for tenant occupancy and exclusive <u>use</u>, including <u>basements</u>, upper floors and mezzanines. It is measured from the centre line of joint partitions and from outside wall faces. For the purposes of this definition, common areas that are not designed nor leased for the exclusive <u>use</u> of the tenant are not included in the calculation of gross leasable floor area.
- c) <u>Net Floor Area</u> means the sum of the <u>gross floor areas</u> of a <u>building</u> above or below grade, but excluding:
 - (i) Motor vehicle parking areas within the building;
 - (ii) Stairways and common hallways not devoted to any individual <u>premises</u>; elevator shafts and other service and mechanical shafts;
 - (iii) Service rooms, mechanical rooms and penthouses;
 - (iv) Washrooms;
 - (v) Waste rooms and recycling rooms;
 - (vi) Staff locker, staff restrooms and staff lunch rooms;
 - (vii) Loading areas within a **building**;
 - (viii) Any space with a floor to ceiling height of less than 1.8 metres; and,
 - (ix) Any part of a <u>basement</u> that is unfinished is used solely for storage purposes and is not accessible to the public.

Floor Space Index (FSI) means the ratio of the gross floor area of all buildings on a lot

divided by the area of the lot on which the buildings are located.

<u>Forest Management</u> means the management of woodlands, including <u>accessory uses</u> such as the construction and maintenance of forest access roads, maple syrup production facilities, for the production of wood and wood products and the provision of outdoor recreation opportunities.

<u>Funeral Establishment</u> means a funeral home, funeral parlour, undertaking establishment, or similar <u>use</u>, for the furnishing of funeral supplies and services to the public and includes facilities intended for the care and preparation of the human body for interment or cremation and, facilities for the coordination of rites and ceremonies with respect to interment or cremation.

<u>Garage Door</u> means an opening used for vehicular access to a <u>private garage</u> from a <u>street</u> or a <u>lane</u>. Where there is more than one opening, the <u>garage door</u> shall be the distance between the two outer extremities of the <u>garage door</u> openings, including any intervening columns, doors, windows, or wall sections which may separate two or more <u>garage door</u> openings.

<u>Golf Course</u> means an area of land laid out for golf with a series of holes including tees, fairways, and putting greens and often one or more natural or artificial hazards, and may include an accessory clubhouse, <u>golf driving range</u>, mini golf, chipping and putting areas and banquet facilities.

<u>Golf Driving Range</u> means an outdoor establishment dedicated to the driving of golf balls from fixed golf tees. A <u>golf driving range</u> may include an accessory clubhouse and chipping and putting areas.

<u>Group Home</u> means an establishment used to provide supervised living accommodations, licensed or funded under Province of Ontario or Government of Canada legislation, for three to ten persons, exclusive of staff, living together in a single housekeeping unit in a group living arrangement.

<u>Hazardous Lands</u> means property or lands that could be unsafe for development due to naturally occurring processes. Along river, stream and small inland lake systems, this means the land, including that covered by water, to the furthest landward limit of the flooding hazard or erosion hazard limits.

<u>Hazardous Sites</u> means property or lands that could be unsafe for development and site <u>alteration</u> due to naturally occurring hazards. These may include unstable soils (sensitive marine clays [leda], organic soils) or unstable bedrock (karst topography).

<u>Hazardous Waste</u> is as defined in <u>Regulation 347</u> of the <u>Environmental Protection Act</u>.

<u>Height</u> (unless otherwise defined in this By-law) means with reference to a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>, the vertical distance measured from the <u>average grade level</u> to:

- a) The highest point of the roof surface or the parapet, whichever is the greater, of a flat roof;
- b) The mean level between the eaves and ridge of a gabled, hip, or other type of pitched roof; and,
- c) In case of a <u>structure</u> with no roof, the highest point of the said <u>structure</u>.

<u>Heritage Building</u> means any <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> located on a property designated under Part IV or Part V of the <u>Ontario Heritage Act</u>, or its successors.

<u>Home Industry</u> means a small-scale <u>industrial use</u>, such as a carpentry shop, a metal working shop, a welding shop or an electrical shop that provides services or wares which is an <u>accessory use</u> to an <u>Agricultural Use</u> or a <u>detached dwelling</u>. For the purpose of this definition, the repairing of <u>motor vehicles</u>, mobile homes or trailers, a paint shop, or furniture stripping is not a <u>home industry</u>.

<u>Home Child Care</u> means the caring of children in a <u>dwelling unit</u> in accordance with the Child Care and Early Years Act.

<u>Home Occupation</u> means an occupation or profession conducted in a residential <u>dwelling unit</u> or <u>accessory building or structure</u> where the business or profession is conducted wholly within the <u>dwelling unit</u> or <u>accessory building or structure</u> in a manner that is accessory to the principal residential <u>use</u>.

<u>Hotel</u> means an establishment for temporary overnight accommodation to the public, and may include meeting facilities, recreation facilities, a <u>restaurant</u>, <u>banquet hall</u>, and <u>retail stores</u>, all of which are accessory and exclusively devoted to the primary temporary overnight accommodation function, and located on the same <u>lot</u>. A <u>hotel</u> shall not contain <u>dwelling units</u>.

<u>Impervious Surface</u> means a surface that does not allow the infiltration of water, such as a rooftop, asphalt pavement, or concrete.

<u>Industrial Use</u> means an establishment used for the warehousing of goods and materials, the assembly of manufactured goods, the manufacturing of goods, the processing of goods, the repair and servicing of goods and similar <u>uses</u>. An <u>industrial use</u> shall not include a <u>commercial storage facility use</u> or <u>motor vehicle</u> related <u>uses</u>.

<u>Infrastructure</u> means physical <u>structures</u> (facilities and corridors) that form the foundation for development. <u>Infrastructure</u> includes: sewage and water systems, septage treatment systems, stormwater management systems, waste management systems, electricity generation facilities, electricity transmission and distribution systems, communications/telecommunications, transit and transportation corridors and facilities, oil and gas pipelines and associated facilities.

<u>Institutional Care Home</u> means an establishment used to provide supervised living accommodations, licensed or funded under Province of Ontario or Government of Canada legislation, for more than ten persons, exclusive of staff, living together in a single housekeeping unit in a group living arrangement.

<u>Kennel</u> means an establishment where domestic pets are boarded or are kept for the purposes of breeding.

<u>Landform Conservation Area</u> means an area that contains important natural landscapes or features that are important for natural heritage, protection, appreciation, scientific study or education.

<u>Landform Conservation Areas</u> include, but are not limited to, kames, kettles, ravines, ridges and other Areas of Natural and Scientific Interest (ANSI's) as defined in the Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Plan.

Landscaped Open Space means an area on a lot that is used exclusively for landscaping.

<u>Landscaping</u> means trees, shrubs, flowers, grass or other horticultural elements, decorative stonework, screening or other architectural elements, all of which are designed to enhance the visual amenity of a property and shall not be used for the parking of <u>motor vehicles</u> or <u>outdoor patios</u>.

<u>Landscaping</u>, <u>Hard</u> includes any combination of brickwork, stonework, interlocking pavers or stones, or other <u>impervious surfaces</u> that are not covered by horticultural elements such as flowers, grass, shrubs, sod, or trees. A <u>deck</u> constructed over an <u>impervious surface</u> is considered <u>hard landscaping</u>.

<u>Landscaping</u>, <u>Soft</u> means that portion of a <u>lot</u> that consists of any combination of trees, shrubs, flowers, grass or other horticultural elements that is not covered by architectural elements including but not limited to: interlocking pavers or stones, asphalt, <u>buildings</u>, brickwork, concrete, stonework or <u>structures</u>.

<u>Landscaping Strip</u> means an area of land at the periphery of a <u>lot</u> that is used exclusively for <u>landscaping</u>. A <u>landscaping strip</u> can be crossed by walkways, <u>drive aisles</u> and ramps that access a <u>lot</u> from a <u>street</u>, <u>lane</u> or abutting <u>lot</u>.

<u>Lane</u> means a right of way owned by the <u>City</u> that is not intended for general traffic circulation and which provides <u>motor vehicle</u> access to an abutting <u>lot</u>.

<u>Liquid Industrial Waste</u> means waste that is both liquid waste and industrial waste but does not include:

- a) hauled sewage;
- b) waste from the operation of sewage works subject to the <u>Ontario Water</u> <u>Resources Act</u>, where the works:
- c) are owned by a municipality;
- d) are owned by the Crown subject to an agreement with a municipality under the Ontario Water Resources Act; or,
- e) receives only waste similar in character to the domestic sewage from a household;
- f) waste from the operation of a water works subject to the <u>Ontario Water</u> <u>Resources Act</u>;
- g) waste that is produced in any month in an amount less than twenty-five litres or otherwise accumulated in an amount less than twenty-five litres;
- h) waste directly discharged by a generator from a waste generation facility into a sewage works subject to the <u>Ontario Water Resources Act</u> or established before April 3, 1957 or into a sewage system regulated under Part 8 of the <u>Ontario Building Code</u> made under the <u>Building Code Act</u>, 1992;
- i) waste that results directly from food processing and preparation operations, including food packing, food preserving, wine making, cheese making and

restaurants;

- j) drilling fluids and produced waters associated with the exploration, development or production of crude oil or natural gas;
- k) processed organic waste; or,
- I) asbestos waste.

<u>Loading Space</u> means an unobstructed area of land that is used for the temporary parking of one or more <u>commercial motor vehicles</u> or <u>commercial motor vehicle</u> trailers while merchandise or materials are being loaded or unloaded from such vehicles or trailers.

<u>Lodging Room</u> means one or more rooms within a <u>building</u> used for sleeping accommodations. <u>Lodging rooms</u> may contain cooking or washroom facilities, but not both.

<u>Long Term Care Home</u> means an establishment in accordance with the <u>Long-Term Care Homes Act</u>, where living accommodation is provided for persons of any age and which has personal and medical care facilities, and may contain common lounges and dining areas. A <u>long term care home</u> may include an accessory <u>respite care home</u> or accessory <u>retirement home</u>.

Lot means a parcel of land that is registered as a legally conveyable parcel of land in the Registry Office and may include:

- a) <u>Corner Lot</u> means a <u>lot</u> at the intersection of two or more <u>streets</u> or upon two parts of the same <u>street</u> with such <u>streets</u> containing an angle of less than or equal to 135 degrees.
- b) <u>Interior Lot</u> means a <u>lot</u> situated between adjacent <u>lots</u> and having access to one <u>street</u>, highway or <u>lane</u>.
- c) Through Lot means a <u>lot</u> that is not a <u>corner lot</u> but has frontage on more than one <u>street</u>. If a <u>lot</u> is a <u>through lot</u>, both of the <u>lot lines</u> abutting the <u>street</u> are deemed to be <u>front lot lines</u>. Notwithstanding the above, where a 0.3 metre wide <u>reserve</u> or greater is located along one of the <u>lot lines</u> abutting a <u>street</u>, the <u>lot</u> is not a <u>through lot</u>.

Lot Area means the total horizontal area within the **lot lines** of a **lot**.

<u>Lot Coverage</u> means the percentage or area of the <u>lot</u> covered by all <u>buildings</u> and <u>structures</u>. <u>Lot coverage</u> in each <u>zone</u> shall be deemed to apply only to that portion of such <u>lot</u> that is located within said <u>zone</u>.

Lot Centre Line means a straight line measured from the middle of the <u>front lot line</u>, to the middle of the <u>rear lot line</u>. In the case where the <u>rear lot line</u> is a point, the <u>lot centre line</u> is measured from the middle of the <u>front lot line</u> to the point that forms the <u>rear lot line</u>.

Lot Depth means the length of the **lot centre line**.

<u>Lot Frontage</u> means the horizontal distance between the <u>interior side lot lines</u> and, or, <u>exterior side lot lines</u>, with such distance being measured perpendicularly to the <u>lot centre line</u>, to a point on that line that is 8.0 metres from the <u>front lot line</u>.

<u>Lot Line</u> means the boundary of a **<u>lot</u>**. Below are the four types of **<u>lot lines</u>**:

- a) <u>Exterior Side Lot Line</u> means the <u>lot line</u> of a <u>corner lot</u>, other than the <u>front lot</u> <u>line</u>, which divides the <u>lot</u> from a <u>street</u>.
- b) <u>Front Lot Line</u> means the <u>lot line</u> which divides the <u>lot</u> from a <u>street</u>, but, in the case of:
 - (i) a <u>corner lot</u>, the shortest of the <u>lot lines</u> that divides the <u>lot</u> from a <u>street</u> shall be deemed to be the <u>front lot line</u>;
 - (ii) a <u>corner lot</u> where such <u>lot lines</u> are of equal length and where one <u>lot</u> <u>line</u> abuts a Regional road or <u>provincial highway</u>, the <u>front lot line</u> shall be deemed to be that line which abuts the Regional road or <u>provincial highway</u>;
 - (iii) a <u>corner lot</u> where such <u>lot lines</u> are of equal length and where both <u>lot</u> <u>lines</u> abut a <u>street</u> under the same jurisdiction, the <u>City</u> may designate either <u>street</u> as the <u>front lot line</u>;
 - (iv) a <u>lot</u> that is separated from a <u>street</u> by a <u>public park</u> and provided the <u>lot</u> is accessed by a <u>lane</u>, the shortest <u>lot line</u> that abuts the <u>public park</u> shall be deemed to be the <u>front lot line</u>; and,
 - (v) a <u>through lot</u>, the longest of the <u>lot lines</u> which divides the <u>lot</u> from the <u>streets</u> shall be deemed to be the <u>front lot line</u>. If both such <u>lot lines</u> are of equal length, the <u>City</u> may designate either <u>street</u> as the <u>front lot line</u>.
- c) Interior Side Lot Line means a lot line, other than a rear lot line that does not

abut a **street**.

d) Rear Lot Line means the lot line opposite to, and most distant from the front lot line. For the purpose of this definition, if two side lot lines join at a point, that point shall be deemed as a rear lot line.

<u>Main Building</u> means a <u>building</u> in which the <u>principal use</u> of a <u>lot</u> is conducted. Attached <u>private garages</u> are considered part of a <u>main building</u>.

<u>Main Building Coverage</u> means the area of the <u>main building</u> that is enclosed by the <u>main walls</u> measured between the exterior faces of the exterior walls. For the purpose of this definition, unenclosed <u>decks</u>, <u>porches</u>, cold cellars, and <u>balconies</u> are not considered to be within the <u>main building coverage</u>.

<u>Main Wall</u> means the exterior front, side and rear wall of a <u>building</u> and all structural components essential to the support of a fully enclosed space.

<u>Major Collector Road</u> means a <u>street</u> owned, operated, managed or maintained by the <u>City</u>, as shown on <u>Map 10</u> of the <u>Official Plan</u>.

<u>Massage Establishment</u> means an establishment where services involving the kneading, manipulation, rubbing, massaging, touching or stimulating by any means a person's body, and may include a licensed massage therapist, but does not include a <u>body rub</u> <u>establishment</u>.

<u>Mausoleum</u> means a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>, other than a <u>columbarium</u>, used for the interment of human remains.

<u>Mechanical Penthouse</u> means a room or enclosure on the roof of a <u>building</u> exclusively used for mechanical equipment, elevator equipment, <u>building</u> services equipment, or any combination thereof. For the purposes of this definition, a stair tower or elevator tower providing access to an outdoor <u>amenity area</u> is a <u>mechanical penthouse</u>.

<u>Medical Office</u> means an establishment used for the medical, dental, surgical and, or therapeutic treatment of human beings by licensed or registered medical professionals, and shall include clinics operated by a number and, or, a variety of practitioners.

Mineral Aggregate Operation means:

a) Lands under licence or permit, other than for wayside pits and quarries, issued in

accordance with the Aggregate Resources Act; and,

b) Associated facilities used in extraction, transport, beneficiation, processing or recycling of <u>mineral aggregate resources</u> and derived products such as asphalt and concrete, or the production of secondary related products.

<u>Mineral Aggregate Resources</u> means gravel, sand, clay, earth, shale, stone, limestone, dolostone, sandstone, marble, granite, rock or other material prescribed under the <u>Aggregate Resources Act</u> suitable for construction, industrial, manufacturing and maintenance purposes but does not include metallic ores, asbestos, graphite, kyanite, mica, nepheline syenite, salt, talc, wollastonite, mine tailings or other material prescribed under the <u>Mining Act</u>.

<u>Minor Collector Road</u> means a <u>street</u> owned, operated, managed or maintained by the <u>City</u>, as shown on <u>Map 11</u> of the <u>Official Plan</u>.

<u>Model Home</u> means a <u>building</u>, which is used on a temporary basis as a sales office or as an example of the type of <u>dwelling unit</u> that is for sale in a related development. A <u>model home</u> shall not be occupied or used as a <u>dwelling unit</u>.

<u>Motor Vehicle</u> means an automobile, motorcycle, motor-assisted bicycle unless otherwise indicated in the <u>Highway Traffic Act</u> and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power.

<u>Motor Vehicle Fueling Station</u> means an establishment for the retail sale of lubricating oils and fuel for <u>motor vehicles</u>. <u>Accessory uses</u> may include a <u>motor vehicle</u> <u>maintenance shop</u>, the sale of <u>motor vehicle</u> parts and accessories, a <u>restaurant</u>, <u>retail</u> <u>store</u> and a <u>motor vehicle</u> washing establishment.

Motor Vehicle Maintenance Shop means an establishment used for the maintenance and minor repair of motor vehicles, such as tire replacement and repair, the changing of fluids, repair of electrical systems, and the installation or replacement of filters or motor vehicle parts, but shall not include a paint or spray booth, or motor vehicle repair and body shop.

Motor Vehicle Repair and Body Shop means an establishment used for major structural, mechanical, painting and cosmetic repair of motor vehicles, and may include a motor vehicle maintenance shop and motor vehicle washing establishment.

Motor Vehicle Rental Office means an establishment used for the rental of motor

vehicles, and does not include onsite or overnight motor vehicle storage.

<u>Motor Vehicle Rental Establishment</u> means an establishment used for the rental of <u>motor vehicles</u>, and includes onsite or overnight <u>motor vehicle</u> storage.

<u>Motor Vehicle Sales Establishment</u> means an establishment used for the lease or sale of <u>motor vehicles</u>. <u>Accessory uses</u> may include a <u>motor vehicle maintenance shop</u>, <u>motor vehicle washing establishment</u>, and the retail sales of <u>motor vehicle</u> parts.

<u>Motor Vehicle</u>, <u>Special</u> means a <u>motor vehicle</u> used for commercial, service or recreational special vehicle purposes. A special vehicle shall include a <u>commercial motor vehicle</u>; and a <u>recreational motor vehicle</u> as follows:

- a) <u>Commercial Motor Vehicle</u> means a <u>motor vehicle</u> used for commercial or service purposes and includes, but is not limited to, school buses, construction trucks, refreshment vehicles or food trucks, delivery vehicles, or any oversized <u>motor vehicle</u> not otherwise defined in this By-law. For the purposes of this definition, any <u>motor vehicle</u> used for the exclusive purposes of farming activities, is not considered a <u>commercial motor vehicle</u>.
- b) Recreational Motor Vehicle means a motor vehicle or trailer that is primarily designed to provide temporary living quarters for recreational camping, travel or seasonal use, whether under its own motor power, or is mounted on, or towed by another vehicle. A recreational motor vehicle includes, but is not limited to, motor homes, travel trailers, fifth wheel travel trailers, tent trailers and campers whether or not the camper is, or is not, attached to a motor vehicle, all-terrain vehicles, boats, motorized personal watercraft, snowmobiles and other similar equipment. For the purposes of this definition, a garden suite is not considered a recreational motor vehicle.

Motor Vehicle Washing Establishment means an establishment used for the washing and detailing of motor vehicles.

<u>Municipal Parking Lot or Garage</u> means an area of land, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> used for the parking of <u>motor vehicles</u> and operated by a <u>public authority</u>.

<u>Municipal Wastewater Services</u> means sewage works within the meaning of Section 1 of the <u>Ontario Water Resources Act</u> that is owned or operated by the Regional Municipality of York.

<u>Municipal Water Services</u> means a municipal drinking-water system within the meaning of Section 2 of the Safe Drinking Water Act.

<u>Neighbouring Lot</u> means a <u>lot</u> or <u>lots</u> immediately abutting either side of a subject <u>lot</u> that fronts on the same side of a <u>street</u>. In the case of a <u>corner lot</u>, a <u>neighbouring lot</u> is the immediately abutting <u>lot</u> that fronts onto the same side of a <u>street</u>.

<u>Net Developable Area</u> means the area of a <u>lot</u> or site, less any area within a key natural heritage feature as identified on <u>Map 5 - Natural Heritage Features and Landforms</u> or, a key hydrologic feature as identified on <u>Map 6 - Hydrologic Features</u> in the <u>Official Plan</u>.

<u>Nightclub</u> means an establishment whose primary function is the provision of theatrical performances, pre-recorded music, dancing or live musical entertainment. A <u>nightclub</u> may include the accessory sale and consumption of food, alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages and includes hookah lounges.

Non-Complying means an existing **building**, **structure** or **lot** that does not comply with the regulations of this By-Law.

Non-Conforming Use means an existing **use** that is not a permitted **use** in the **zone** in which the said **use** is situated.

Non-Profit Organization means an incorporated organization that is established and which is operated in a manner that does not result in the generation of profits.

Non-Profit Private Club means an establishment used as a meeting place by members and guests of members of non-commercial community service and non-profit organizations.

<u>Noxious Use</u> means a <u>use</u> which from its nature or operation, creates a nuisance, or is liable to become a nuisance or offensive by the creation of noise or vibration, or by reason of the emission of gas, fumes, dust, or objectionable odour, or by reason of the unsightly storage of goods, wares, merchandise, salvage, refuse matter, waste or other material.

Office Building means a building designed to be primarily occupied by business offices.

<u>Office Supply or Computer Retail Store</u> means a <u>retail store</u> where the sale of office supplies and equipment or computers is the primary focus.

Outdoor Display and Sales Area means an outdoor open space area, used in conjunction with the main building on the same lot, for the accessory display and, or sale of produce, merchandise or the supply of services in association with the principal use of the lot. Such a display and, or sales area may be wholly or partially contained within a temporary tent structure.

Outdoor Patio means an outdoor patron area that is accessory to a non-residential use.

<u>Outdoor Storage</u>, <u>Accessory</u> means an area of land that is accessory to the <u>principal use</u> on the same <u>lot</u>, for the storage of goods and materials in the open air or in portable objects such as <u>shipping containers</u>.

<u>Outdoor Storage Use</u> means an area of land whose <u>principal use</u> is for the storage of goods and materials such as a <u>motor vehicle</u> wrecking <u>yard</u>, a <u>motor vehicle</u> storage compound or a construction equipment and, or materials <u>yard</u>.

<u>Outside Wall Height</u> means the vertical distance from <u>established grade</u> to the highest top plate of the outside wall of the upper most floor or <u>storey</u>.

<u>Parcel of Tied Land</u> means a freehold parcel of land or any parcel of land with an attached interest in a common elements condominium corporation.

<u>Parking Aisle</u> means a defined area adjacent to a <u>parking space</u> or <u>loading space</u> that provides access for <u>motor vehicles</u> from a <u>drive aisle</u> to a <u>parking space</u> or <u>loading space</u>.

<u>Parking Area</u> means an open area of land not located within a <u>street</u> or <u>lane</u> that is used for the parking of <u>motor vehicles</u>, but shall not include the parking or storage of <u>motor vehicles</u> for the purpose of sale, rent, or repair.

<u>Parking Garage</u> means a <u>building</u>, or part thereof, used for the parking or storage of <u>motor vehicles</u> designed to be accessed by <u>multiple dwellings</u>, <u>apartment dwellings</u>, or by non-residential units.

<u>Parking Pad</u> means an open area of land in any residential low rise <u>zone</u>, other than a <u>driveway</u>, that provides access to <u>motor vehicles</u> from a <u>street</u> or <u>lane</u>, and that is paved or treated with a stable surface that is used for the parking of <u>motor vehicles</u>.

<u>Parking Space</u> means a space that has been designed and, or located for the parking of motor vehicles.

<u>Personal Service Establishment</u> means a <u>use</u> where a service is performed for the grooming, repair, or cleaning, or treatment of a person or their apparel, and may include a hairdresser, barber shop, beauty shop, spa, sauna, shoe repair, dry cleaning establishment, or laundromat, or <u>massage establishment</u>.

<u>Pervious Surface</u> means a surface that allows the filtration of water into the underlying soil and shall not include asphalt, concrete, stone, interlocking stone or other similar <u>impervious surfaces</u>.

<u>Pet Services Establishment</u> means an establishment for the aesthetic care, animal daycare, or a training centre for animals intended for use by domestic pets, located within a wholly enclosed <u>building</u>. A <u>pet services establishment</u> shall not provide for overnight accommodation or include a <u>kennel</u>.

<u>Place of Worship</u> means a <u>building</u> or part of a <u>building</u> used by a charitable religious group(s) for a <u>sanctuary</u> and may include <u>accessory uses</u> that includes programs for community social benefit, which are subordinate and incidental to the practice of religious rites. A <u>cemetery</u>, <u>child care centre</u>, or <u>private school</u> are not permitted <u>accessory uses</u> to a <u>place of worship</u>.

<u>Podium</u> means the base or lower portion of a multi-<u>storey building</u>, which is located above <u>average grade level</u>, and is measured from <u>average grade level</u> to the maximum <u>podium height</u> as set out in the applicable <u>zone</u>. A <u>podium</u> may or may not have a <u>point</u> <u>tower</u> projecting above it.

<u>Point Tower</u> means portions of a <u>building</u> that projects above a <u>podium</u>.

<u>Porch</u> means a <u>structure</u> with a floor and roof, and at least two other sides that are open and unenclosed that are accessed directly from grade which provides access to the <u>first storey</u> of a <u>dwelling unit</u>. In the case of a <u>townhouse dwelling</u> and a <u>back-to-back townhouse dwelling</u>, at least one side of the <u>porch</u> shall be open and unenclosed.

Portable Asphalt Plant means an establishment:

- a) With equipment designed to heat and, or, dry aggregate and to mix aggregate with bituminous asphalt to produce asphalt paving material, and includes stockpiling and storage of bulk materials used in the process; and,
- b) Which is not of permanent construction, but which is to be dismantled at the

completion of the construction project.

Portable Concrete Plant means a building or structure:

- With equipment designed to mix cementing materials, aggregate, water and admixtures to produce concrete, and includes stockpiling and storage of bulk materials used in the process; and,
- b) Which is not of permanent construction, but which is designed to be dismantled at the completion of the construction project.

<u>Premises</u> means the area of <u>buildings</u> or part thereof, occupied or used by an individual business or enterprise.

Principal Use means the primary purpose for which a lot, building, or structure is used.

<u>Private Garage</u> means an enclosed <u>structure</u>, <u>building</u>, or part thereof, accessory to a <u>detached dwelling</u>, <u>semi-detached dwelling</u>, <u>townhouse dwelling</u>, or other individual <u>dwelling unit</u>, designed for the storage or parking of one or more <u>motor vehicles</u>.

<u>Private Hospital</u> under the <u>Private Hospitals Act</u>, means a facility where four or more persons may be admitted for the purpose of treatment. A <u>private hospital</u> shall not include:

- a) a children's residence licensed under Part IX (Residential Licensing) of the Child, Youth and Child and Family Services Act, 2017;
- b) a community health facility within the meaning of the <u>Oversight of Health</u> <u>Facilities and Devices Act</u>, 2017;
- c) a group home;
- d) an <u>institutional care home</u>;
- e) a <u>long term care home</u>;
- f) a **medical office**;
- g) a <u>public hospital</u> as defined by the <u>Public Hospitals Act</u>;

- h) a respite care home;
- i) a retirement home;
- j) a <u>shared housing large scale</u>;
- k) a shared housing small scale; and,
- a <u>shared housing supervised care home</u>.

<u>Private Park</u> means an area of land that is publicly accessible and intended for active or passive recreational <u>uses</u>, but is privately owned and maintained.

<u>Private Street</u> means a private right-of-way that is used by <u>motor vehicles</u> but is not owned by the <u>City</u> or any other <u>public authority</u>.

<u>Provincial Highway</u> means a <u>street</u> owned, operated, managed or maintained by the Province of Ontario, as shown as a <u>provincial highway</u> or Provincial 400 Series Highway on Map 10 of the Official Plan.

<u>Public Authority</u> means any commission, board, or authority or any quasi-public body that is controlled by the Federal and, or, Provincial governments and, or, any commission, board, or authority or any quasi-public body controlled by the Regional Municipality of York and, or, the <u>City</u>, provided it is owned or operated by or for, or under the authority of, the Government of Canada, the Province of Ontario, the Regional Municipality of York or the <u>City</u>.

<u>Public Easement</u> means an instrument that is registered on title that provides for the <u>use</u> of or, access across, land subject to the easement, including but not limited to, sewer, water, drainage or utility purposes and which may include a right-of-way in favour of a <u>public authority</u>.

<u>Public Facility</u> means an establishment owned and operated by a <u>public authority</u> that includes, but is not limited to the following:

- a) Playgrounds;
- b) Community centres;
- c) Ambulance, fire and police stations;

- d) Public washrooms;
- e) Museums;
- f) Art galleries;
- g) <u>Stormwater management facilities;</u>
- h) Sewage treatment facilities;
- i) Public schools;
- j) <u>Universities</u> or <u>colleges</u>; and,
- k) Affordable housing developments as identified in Section 11.2 of the Official Plan

<u>Public Hospital</u> means an establishment for the purpose of the treatment of persons, as defined under the <u>Public Hospitals Act</u> as a hospital.

<u>Public Park</u> means any area of land under the jurisdiction of a <u>public authority</u> that is designed and, or, maintained for recreational purposes and is open to the public. A <u>public park</u> may include playgrounds, <u>golf courses</u>, <u>swimming pools</u>, tennis courts, bowling greens, botanical gardens and sports fields, and may contain accessory <u>retail stores</u>.

<u>Public Use</u> means any <u>use</u> of land, <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u> owned by or operated on behalf of a <u>public authority</u>.

Reserve means a strip of land abutting a **street** and owned by the authority having jurisdiction over such a **street**.

Respite Day Program Establishment means an establishment offering the temporary care of older adults, persons with disabilities, or other persons requiring supervised care on a temporary basis, which provides day programs, education, training or supervision to participants, such as an adult day program, but does not include overnight stays. Child care centres or schools are not considered as respite day program establishments.

Respite Care Home means a temporary institutional care of the infirmed, sick, elderly, or other persons requiring supervised care for overnight stays, and may include an

accessory respite day program establishment.

<u>Restaurant</u> means an establishment in which the preparation and serving of food and beverages are sold to the public for consumption, and may include table service within or outside the <u>building</u>, and may include a <u>take-out restaurant</u>.

Restaurant, Take-Out means a **premises** designed and used for the sale of food or refreshments to the public for consumption off the **premises** and may include, as an **accessory use**, a seating area for up to twelve patrons.

<u>Retail Store</u> means an establishment in which goods; wares, merchandise, substances, articles or things are displayed, rented or sold directly to the public. A <u>retail store</u> includes, but is not limited to, a supermarket and an <u>office supply or computer retail store</u>.

Retirement Home means a residential <u>building</u> or part of a residential <u>building</u> used for semi-independent living accommodation, in accordance with the <u>Retirement Homes Act</u>, and may include a <u>dwelling unit</u>.

Rooming House - Large Scale means a <u>building</u> where lodging is provided in return for remuneration or services (or both) in more than five <u>lodging rooms</u>. A <u>rooming house-large scale</u> may include one <u>dwelling unit</u> in addition to the <u>lodging rooms</u>, but does not include <u>shared housing - large scale</u>, <u>shared housing - small scale</u> or <u>shared housing - supervised care home</u>.

<u>Rooming House - Small Scale</u> means a <u>building</u> where lodging is provided in return for remuneration or services (or both) in three to five <u>lodging rooms</u>. A <u>rooming house - small scale</u> may include one <u>dwelling unit</u> in addition to the <u>lodging rooms</u>, but does not include <u>shared housing - large scale</u>, <u>shared housing - small scale</u> or <u>shared housing - supervised care home</u>.

<u>Sanctuary</u> means a room or series of rooms in which general worship services or religious rites are held.

<u>School</u> means an establishment where instruction is provided to students as the <u>principal use</u>. <u>Schools</u> that are regulated in this By-law are defined below:

a) <u>College</u> means a publicly funded or publicly assisted community <u>college</u> that receives ongoing operating funding and, or, grants from the Province of Ontario, and which may include a <u>child care centre</u>.

- b) <u>Commercial School</u> means a <u>school</u> conducted for profit, that provides organized instruction or training in art, hobbies, or trades. A <u>commercial school</u> may include, but is not limited to, musical instruction, computer training, driving instruction, an adult day program centre, and tutoring services. A <u>commercial school</u> shall not include a <u>day camp</u>, <u>recreational fitness centre</u>, a <u>private school</u>, or <u>studio fitness centre</u>.
- c) <u>Public School</u> means an academic <u>school</u> under the jurisdiction of the York Region District School Board, the York Catholic District School Board, the Conseil Scolaire de district du Centre Sud-Ouest, the Conseil Scolaire de district Catholique Centre-Sud, or other similar provincially approved educational institution or parochial <u>school</u> operated on a non-profit basis, and may include an accessory <u>child care centre</u>.
- d) <u>Private school</u> means a <u>building</u> used as an academic <u>school</u> that follows the Ministry of Education's curriculum for elementary and, or, secondary <u>schools</u>, and which secures the major part of its funding from private sources.
- e) <u>University</u> means a publicly funded or publicly assisted <u>university</u> that receives ongoing operating funding and, or, grants from the Province of Ontario, and which may include a <u>child care centre</u>.

<u>School Portable</u> means a temporary <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> designed to serve as a classroom on a <u>lot</u> that is also the site of a <u>public school</u>.

<u>Service and Repair Establishment</u> means an establishment used primarily for the repair of household articles, lawn and garden equipment, small engine devices, and small electric motors, but shall not include shops for the repair of <u>motor vehicles</u>.

<u>Setback</u> means the distance of a <u>structure</u> or other feature, from the property line or other feature.

<u>Shared Housing - Large Scale</u> means a form of housing where more than ten persons share accommodations with support services and may include a <u>respite care home</u>, <u>retirement home</u> or <u>institutional care home</u>.

<u>Shared Housing - Small Scale</u> means a form of housing where three to ten persons share accommodations with support services and may include a <u>group home</u>, <u>respite care home</u> or <u>retirement home</u>.

<u>Shared Housing - Supervised Care Home</u> means an establishment for persons where living accommodations are provided that contain supervised, personal and medical care facilities, common lounges and dining areas. <u>Shared housing - supervised care home</u> may include a <u>group home</u>, <u>institutional care home</u>, <u>long term care home</u>, <u>respite care home</u> or <u>retirement home</u>.

Shipping Container means a freight container that is used for the transportation and storage of goods and materials that can be loaded onto trucks, trains or ships for the purpose of moving goods and materials. A **shipping container** shall also include, but is not limited to, the body of a transport trailer or a straight truck and any prefabricated portable metal storage unit. For the purpose of this definition, a **shipping container** does not have wheels or include a **motor vehicle** or a transport trailer.

<u>Shopping Centre</u> means a <u>building</u> or a group of <u>buildings</u> containing a combination of permitted non-residential <u>uses</u> which have been designed, developed, and managed as one unit by a single owner or tenant, or group of owners and tenants, as distinguished from a business area comprised of unrelated individual <u>uses</u>.

Short Term Accommodation means an establishment that operates or offers a place of temporary overnight accommodation by way of concession, permit, lease, licence, rental agreement or similar commercial arrangements for overnight accommodation, for one or more periods of less than 30 consecutive days, and not more than 180 total days over the duration of the calendar year, within a <u>dwelling unit</u> that is the principal residence of the proprietor of the establishment.

<u>Stacking Space</u> means a space specifically designated as a waiting area for <u>motor</u> <u>vehicles</u> patronizing a <u>drive-through service establishment</u>.

<u>Stepback</u> means a portion of a <u>building</u> that is set back further from a <u>lot line</u> than any other portion of a <u>building</u>.

Storey means the portion of a <u>building</u> that is situated between the top of any floor and the top of the floor next above it. Where there is no floor above, <u>storey</u> means the portion of a <u>building</u> that is situated between the top of the floor and the ceiling above the floor. Any portion of a <u>building</u> partly below <u>average grade level</u> shall be deemed a <u>storey</u> where its ceiling is at least 50% above <u>average grade level</u>. A <u>mechanical penthouse</u> shall not be considered a <u>storey</u> or part thereof.

Stormwater Management Facility means a detention basin, underground tank or other

similar facility designed to temporarily store collected stormwater runoff and release it at a controlled rate. A <u>Stormwater management facility</u> may include a <u>stormwater management pond</u>.

<u>Stormwater Management Pond</u> means a naturalized detention basin designed to temporarily store collected stormwater runoff and release it at a controlled rate.

<u>Street</u> means a roadway owned by a <u>public authority</u>, which may include a <u>provincial</u> <u>highway</u>, but which does not include a <u>lane</u>.

<u>Student Residence</u> means a <u>building</u> that is operated by a <u>public authority</u> and designed and used to accommodate students that are attending a <u>college</u> or <u>university</u>.

<u>Structure</u> means anything that is erected, built or constructed of parts joined together and attached or fixed permanently to the ground. For the purpose of this definition, the following are deemed to not be <u>structures</u>:

- a) Fences;
- b) Light standards;
- c) Transformers;
- d) Signs;
- e) Natural gas or electricity metres;
- f) Air conditioning units;
- g) Antennas;
- h) Freestanding mailboxes;
- i) **Driveway** entrance feature statues;
- Storage lockers or dog houses, under 1.5 metres high, and under 10.0 square metres;
- Pool pumps and filters not inside accessory buildings or structures;
- Flag poles;
- m) Trellises;
- n) Shopping cart enclosures;

- o) Waste receptacles;
- p) School bus shelters;
- q) Composters;
- r) <u>Electric Vehicle Charging Stations</u>;
- s) **Swimming Pools**
- t) Planters; and,
- u) Barbeques.

<u>Swimming Pool</u> means any body of water located outdoors contained in whole by artificial means, in which the depth of the water at any point can exceed 0.6 metres, and includes spas, hot tubs, landscaped ponds, wading pools, inflatable pools, above ground <u>swimming pools</u>, and in-ground <u>swimming pools</u>.

<u>Tandem Parking Space</u> means a <u>parking space</u> that is located behind another <u>parking space</u> and which, if used, prevents the other <u>parking space</u> from being accessed by a <u>motor vehicle</u> and shall not include parking on mechanical lifts.

<u>Total Developable Area</u> means the total area of the property less the area occupied by key natural heritage features, key hydrologic features and any related vegetation protection **zones** as identified by the Official Plan.

<u>Trade and Convention Centre</u> means a <u>building</u> or part of a <u>building</u> where facilities are provided for the displaying of goods and, or services for the general public, such as an auto show or a computer trade show or where groups of people meet for civic, educational, political, religious or social purposes.

<u>Transport Terminal</u> means an establishment used for the purpose of storing, servicing, washing, repairing or loading of trucks and, or transport trailers with materials or goods which are not manufactured, assembled, or processed on the same <u>lot</u>.

<u>Use</u> means the purpose for which any land, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> is arranged, designed, occupied or maintained.

<u>Utility Trailer</u> means any portable unit so constructed as to be suitable for attachment to a <u>motor vehicle</u> and capable of being used for the transportation of goods and, or, equipment.

<u>Veterinary Clinic</u> means an establishment where a licenced member of the College of Veterinarians of Ontario as identified under the <u>Veterinarians Act</u>, treats domestic animals, birds or other livestock. A <u>veterinary clinic</u> may contain as an <u>accessory use</u>, boarding facilities for the purposes of animals undergoing treatment and recovery, but shall not include a <u>kennel</u>.

<u>Wayside Pits and Quarries</u> means a temporary pit or quarry opened and used by or for a <u>public authority</u> solely for the purpose of a particular project or contract of road construction and not located on the road right-of-way.

<u>Yard</u> means an open, uncovered space on a <u>lot</u> between a <u>building</u> and a <u>lot line</u> and which is unoccupied by <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u> except as specifically permitted in this By-law. The four types of <u>yards</u> are defined below:

- a) Exterior Side Yard means the yard of a corner lot extending from the front yard to the rear yard between the exterior side lot line and the nearest main wall of the main building or structure on the lot.
- b) <u>Front Yard</u> means a <u>yard</u> extending across the full width of the <u>lot</u> between the <u>front lot line</u> and the nearest <u>main wall</u> of the <u>main building</u> or <u>structure</u> on the <u>lot</u>.
- c) <u>Interior Side Yard</u> means a <u>yard</u> other than an <u>exterior side yard</u> that extends from the <u>front yard</u> to the <u>rear yard</u> between the <u>interior side lot line</u> and the <u>main wall</u> of the <u>main building</u> or <u>structure</u> on the <u>lot</u>.
- d) Rear Yard means a <u>yard</u> extending across the full width of the <u>lot</u> between the <u>rear lot line</u> and the nearest <u>main wall</u> of the <u>main building</u> or <u>structure</u> on the <u>lot</u>.

Zone means a classification of a land **use** shown on the Zoning schedules of this By-law.

PART 4.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS THAT APPLY IN ALL ZONES

4.1 BARRIER-FREE ACCESS

Nothing in this By-law prevents the establishment of <u>barrier-free</u> access in accordance with the requirements of the <u>Ontario Building Code</u> and the <u>Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act</u>. In addition, nothing prevents the location of <u>barrier-free</u> access in a <u>private garage</u> that is attached to a <u>dwelling unit</u> provided the required number of <u>parking spaces</u> can still be provided.

4.2 FRONTAGE ON A STREET

Unless otherwise specified in this By-law, no person shall erect any building or structure and no person shall use any building or structure or lot unless the lot:

- a) Abuts or fronts on a <u>street</u> which is assumed by a <u>public authority</u> for maintenance purposes; or,
- b) Is being constructed pursuant to a Subdivision Agreement with a public authority; or,
- c) Fronts on a year round maintained <u>street</u> that was not established as a consequence of Registering a Plan of Subdivision; or,
- d) Abuts or fronts on a <u>private street</u> within a Plan of Condominium that either provides direct access to a <u>street</u> or which connects with other <u>private streets</u> within a Plan of Condominium or other Plans of Condominium to access a <u>street</u>.

Unless otherwise specified in this By-law, the <u>front lot line</u> of a <u>lot</u> separated from a <u>street</u> by a <u>reserve</u> or an open space block owned by a <u>public authority</u> shall be deemed to abut such a <u>street</u>.

4.3 PHASED CONDOMINIUM DEVELOPMENT

Unless provided elsewhere, where a Plan of Condominium is proposed to be developed as a phased condominium as defined and set out in the <u>Condominium Act</u>, the lands shall be considered as one singular property for the purpose of determining conformity with the provisions of this By-law and temporary <u>lot lines</u> created as a result of the phasing shall not be considered.

4.4 MEASUREMENT OF SETBACKS AND YARDS

- a) Where two <u>lot lines</u> meeting at the intersection of two <u>streets</u> and, or, a <u>street</u> and a <u>lane</u> are curved where they meet, the <u>yards</u> and <u>setbacks</u> required in this By-law shall be measured to the hypothetical <u>front lot line</u>, <u>interior side lot line</u>, or <u>exterior side lot line</u>, projected from the tangent of the actual <u>lot line</u> in question.
- b) Where an area of land has been dedicated for a utility or snow storage notch, the <u>yards</u> and <u>setbacks</u> required in this By-law shall be measured from the extension of the <u>lot line</u> in question on the side of the utility or snow storage notch closest to the <u>street</u> or <u>lane</u>.
- c) No <u>building</u> or <u>structures</u>, including encroachments such as eaves or gutters, may extend beyond the actual property line.

4.5 SIGHT TRIANGLES

- a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this By-law, no <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>, fence, wall, <u>driveway</u>, <u>parking pad</u> or other hard surface or vegetative planting or <u>landscaping</u> that has a <u>height</u> of greater than 0.75 metres above <u>average grade level</u> shall be permitted in a sight line triangle as defined in sub-section b).
- b) A sight line triangle is that portion of a <u>corner lot</u> within the triangular space on a <u>lot</u> that is formed by creating a triangle that extends 6.0 metres from the hypothetical point of intersection of the <u>front yard</u> and <u>exterior side lot lines</u>.

4.6 PUBLIC USES, ACTIVITIES, OR INFRASTRUCTURE PERMITTED IN ALL ZONES

- a) Public uses or activities or infrastructure are permitted in all zones, unless such uses are expressly prohibited in this By-law. Examples of public uses and infrastructure include, but are not limited to:
 - (i) Municipal sewage services and <u>municipal water services</u>;
 - (ii) Publicly owned and operated <u>community centres</u> and libraries, provided the <u>use</u> is located on an <u>arterial road</u>, a <u>major collector road</u> or <u>minor collector road</u> as shown on Maps 10 and 11 of the Official Plan;
 - (iii) <u>Community gardens</u>;
 - (iv) Gateway features;
 - (v) Government offices;
 - (vi) Municipal parking lots or garages;
 - (vii) **Public parks**;
 - (viii) Public works yards;
 - (ix) Stormwater management facilities;
 - (x) Telecommunication <u>infrastructure</u>;
 - (xi) Any component of a public transit system;
 - (xii) Any component of a municipal utility, including a municipal district heating and, or, cooling system;
 - (xiii) Essential emergency services; and,
 - (xiv) Electric vehicle charging stations.
- b) Where a **public use** is permitted, the following provisions apply:
 - (i) Such <u>public use</u> must comply with all applicable <u>zone</u> standards, and parking and loading requirements of the <u>zone</u> in which it is located.
 - (ii) Notwithstanding subsection 4.6 b) (i) above, where one or more abutting or adjacent <u>lots</u> are owned by the same <u>public authority</u>, the abutting <u>lots</u> shall be deemed to be one <u>lot</u> for the purpose of applying zoning provisions for a <u>public use</u>.
 - iii) No <u>accessory outdoor storage</u> is permitted unless specifically permitted in the <u>zone</u> in which the <u>public use</u> is located.

- c) Notwithstanding subsections a) and b) above, no <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u> associated with a <u>public use</u> are permitted if <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u> are specifically prohibited in a <u>zone</u>.
- d) Notwithstanding subsections a) and b) above, <u>public schools</u>, <u>colleges</u> and <u>universities</u> and <u>student residences</u> are only permitted if such <u>use</u> is expressly permitted in a <u>zone</u>.
- e) Notwithstanding subsection a) above, <u>infrastructure</u> is only permitted in a Greenway One (GWY1) <u>zone</u> if approved by a <u>public</u> <u>authority</u>.

4.7 USES PROHIBITED IN ALL ZONES

The following <u>uses</u> are not part of any <u>use</u> permitted in this By-law, unless expressly permitted in this By-law:

- a) The <u>use</u> of any <u>lot</u> without a <u>main building</u> on the same <u>lot</u>;
- b) The <u>use</u> of any tent, trailer, coach body, rail car, or <u>motor vehicle</u> for human habitation;
- c) The storage or <u>use</u> of <u>shipping containers</u> on a <u>lot</u> unless <u>accessory outdoor storage</u> is specifically permitted on the <u>lot</u> in this By-law or if the <u>shipping container</u> is permitted on a temporary basis on a <u>lot</u> in a Residential <u>zone</u> in accordance with <u>Part 6.0</u> of this By-law;
- d) The permanent placement of <u>shipping containers</u> on a <u>lot</u> in a Residential <u>zone</u>;
- e) The <u>outdoor storage</u> of disused or partially dismantled <u>motor</u> <u>vehicles</u>, rail cars, streetcars, buses, truck bodies, trailers, appliances, or other scrap;
- f) The parking or storage of trailers or <u>commercial motor vehicles</u> on a vacant <u>lot</u>, unless an <u>accessory outdoor storage</u> <u>use</u> is permitted on the <u>lot</u> in this By-law;

- g) The parking or storage of trailers or <u>commercial motor vehicles</u> on a <u>lot</u> for the purposes of advertising;
- h) The manufacturing, refining, rendering or distillation of acid, ammonia, ammunitions, chlorine, coal, creosote, explosives, fireworks, glue, petroleum or tar;

- o) The following <u>uses</u> on <u>hazardous lands</u> or <u>hazardous sites</u>:
 - (i) <u>Home child care</u>;
 - (ii) Long term care homes;
 - (iii) Motor vehicle repair and body shops;
 - (iv) Motor vehicle maintenance shops;
 - (v) Non-profit organizations;
 - (vi) **Private schools**;
 - (vii) Private hospitals;
 - (viii) Public hospitals;
 - (ix) **Public schools**;
 - (x) Retirement homes;
 - (xi) Shared housing, large scale;
 - (xii) Shared housing, small scale;
 - (xiii) Shared housing, supervised care home;
 - (xiv) Short term accommodation;
 - (xv) Student residences;

- p) The manufacturing, refining, rendering or distillation of acid, ammonia, chlorine, coal, creosote, explosives, fireworks, glue, petroleum or tar;
- q) The bulk storage of industrial chemicals, fuels and oils; and the disposal, manufacture, treatment or storage of hazardous waste or liquid industrial waste, unless specifically permitted by the Environmental Protection Act; and,
- r) <u>Noxious uses</u>;

4.8 SPECIAL STANDARDS

4.8.1 ACCESSORY BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES

Unless otherwise identified in this By-law, <u>accessory buildings or</u> <u>structures</u> are subject to the following provisions:

- a) No accessory building or structure shall:
 - (i) Be erected on a <u>lot</u> prior to the erection of the <u>main</u> <u>building</u> on the <u>lot</u>;
 - (ii) Be used for human habitation unless expressly permitted in this By-law;
 - (iii) Be located within a <u>public easement</u>;
 - (iv) Be located within a <u>front yard</u>, or a <u>front yard</u> and an <u>exterior side yard</u> within a Mixed Use <u>zone</u>; and,
 - (v) Exceed 15 square metres if located on <u>hazardous lands</u> or <u>hazardous sites</u>.
- b) The maximum permitted gross floor area per accessory building or structure is:
 - (i) 15 square metres if the <u>lot area</u> is less than or equal to 500 square metres;
 - (ii) 20 square metres if the <u>lot area</u> is greater than 500 square metres and less than 4,000 square metres;
 - (iii) 60 square metres if the <u>lot area</u> is 4,000 square metres or greater.

- c) The maximum number of <u>accessory buildings or structures</u> permitted on a **lot** is:
 - (i) 2 if the <u>lot area</u> is less than or equal to 4,000 square metres:
 - (ii) 4 if the lot area is greater than 4,000 square metres.
- d) The maximum <u>height</u> per <u>accessory building or structure</u> is:
 - (i) 3.0 metres if the <u>lot area</u> is less than or equal to 4,000 square metres;
 - (ii) 5.5 metres if the <u>lot area</u> is greater than 4,000 square metres.
- e) The minimum <u>setback</u> for an <u>accessory building or structure</u> from the <u>interior side lot line</u> and <u>rear lot line</u> is:
 - (i) 1.2 metres;
 - (ii) Notwithstanding (i) above, the <u>setback</u> may be reduced to 0.5 metres if the <u>lot area</u> is less than 4,000 square metres and the wall of the <u>building</u> has no doors or windows on the wall facing the <u>lot line</u>;
 - (iii) Where an <u>accessory building or structure</u> is located between the <u>main building</u> and an <u>interior side lot line</u>, the minimum <u>setback</u> for an <u>accessory building or structure</u> from the <u>interior side lot line</u> shall be equal to the required <u>interior side vard</u> for the <u>main building</u>.
- f) The minimum <u>setback</u> for an <u>accessory building or structure</u> from the <u>exterior side lot line</u> shall be no less than the <u>setback</u> between the <u>main building</u> and the <u>exterior side lot line</u> on any sized <u>lot</u>.
- g) The minimum <u>setback</u> for an <u>accessory building or structure</u> from any other <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> on the <u>lot</u> is 1.8 metres.
- h) Notwithstanding (e) above, within a Mixed Use <u>zone</u>, no <u>accessory</u> <u>building or structure</u> shall be located within 3.0 metres of a residential <u>zone</u> boundary.

4.8.2 DETACHED PRIVATE GARAGES

4.8.2.1 DETACHED PRIVATE GARAGES ON LOTS NOT ACCESSED BY A LANE

One detached <u>private garage</u> is permitted accessory to a <u>dwelling unit</u> on a <u>lot</u> not accessed by a <u>lane</u> provided:

- a) The <u>height</u> of a detached <u>private garage</u> is no greater than 4.5 metres;
- b) The maximum <u>lot coverage</u> of a detached <u>private garage</u> is the greater of:
 - (i) 15%; or,
 - (ii) 36 square metres.
- c) The detached **private garage** is located a minimum of:
 - (i) 1.2 metres from the rear lot line;
 - (ii) 1.2 metres from the interior side lot line;
 - (iii) The required <u>exterior side yard</u> for the <u>main building</u> from the <u>exterior side lot line</u>; and,
 - (iv) Notwithstanding iii) above, the <u>garage door</u> opening for a <u>motor vehicle</u> shall be set back a minimum of 5.8 metres from a <u>lot line</u> abutting a <u>street</u> that provides access to the <u>lot</u>.

4.8.2.2 DETACHED PRIVATE GARAGES ON LOTS ACCESSED BY A LANE

One detached <u>private garage</u> is permitted on a <u>lot</u> accessed by a <u>lane</u> provided:

- a) The detached **private garage** is located in the **rear yard**;
- b) The parking or storing of <u>motor vehicles</u> or <u>special motor vehicles</u> is not permitted in the <u>setback</u> area set out in subsection (a);

- c) The <u>height</u> of a detached <u>private garage</u> is no greater than 4.5 metres, and the maximum <u>height</u> of a <u>private garage</u> containing a <u>coach house</u> is 8.0 metres;
- d) The detached **private garage** is located a minimum of:
 - (i) 6.0 metres from the main building on the lot;
 - (ii) 0.6 metres from the rear lot line;
 - (iii) The required <u>exterior side yard setback</u> for the <u>main</u> <u>building</u> from the <u>exterior side lot line</u>; and,
 - (iv) 1.2 metres from the <u>interior side lot line</u> which can be reduced to 0.5 metres if there are no doors or windows on the wall facing the <u>interior side lot line</u> and reduced to 0 metres if the detached <u>private garage</u> shares a common wall with a detached <u>private garage</u> on an abutting <u>lot</u>.

4.8.3 **DECKS**

<u>Decks</u> are permitted associated with all dwelling types except <u>apartment</u> <u>dwellings</u>, in accordance with the following regulations:

- a) <u>Decks</u> that have a <u>height</u> of between 0.61 metres and 1.0 metre above the lowest ground surface at all points around the perimeter of the platform are permitted provided that:
 - (i) The <u>deck</u> is located no closer than 3.0 metres to the <u>rear</u> lot line;
 - (ii) The <u>deck</u> is located no closer to the <u>interior side lot line</u> than the <u>interior side yard</u> requirement for the <u>main</u> building;
 - (iii) The <u>deck</u> is located no closer to the <u>exterior side lot line</u> than the required <u>exterior side yard</u> for the <u>main building</u>; and,
 - (iv) The <u>deck</u> is not located in the <u>front yard</u>.
- b) <u>Decks</u> that have a <u>height</u> greater than 1.0 metre above the lowest ground surface at any point around the perimeter of the platform are permitted to extend from the wall closest to the <u>rear lot line</u> a maximum of 3.7 metres, (except if the <u>lot</u> is the site of a detached <u>private garage</u>), provided:

- (i) The <u>deck</u> is located no closer than 3.0 metres to the <u>rear</u> <u>lot line</u>;
- (ii) The <u>deck</u> is located no closer to the <u>interior side lot line</u> than the <u>interior side yard</u> requirement for the <u>main</u> building;
- (iii) The <u>deck</u> is located no closer to the <u>exterior side lot line</u> than the required <u>exterior side yard</u> for the <u>main building</u>;
- (iv) The floor of the <u>deck</u> is not higher than the floor level of the <u>first storey</u> of the <u>main building</u>; and,
- (v) The <u>deck</u> does not extend more than 1.5 metres into the setback area required by subsection 4.8.3 a) above.
- c) Notwithstanding the above provisions, stair landings less than 1.0 square metres, and stairs used to access a <u>deck</u> shall not be subject to the <u>setback</u> requirements of this Section, provided they are no closer than 0.6 metres from any <u>lot line</u>.
- d) <u>Decks</u> with a <u>height</u> less than 1.0 metres are permitted to encroach into the <u>setback</u> area required by subsection 4.8.3 a) above.

4.8.4 EXCEPTIONS TO HEIGHT REQUIREMENTS IN ALL ZONES

The **height** requirements of this By-law shall not apply to:

- a) Communication towers and antennas;
- b) Ornamental roof construction features such as unoccupied towers, steeples, or cupolas.
- c) Water storage tanks;
- d) Aggregate processing facilities;
- e) <u>Buildings</u> or <u>structures</u> associated with a public or municipal works depot including but not limited to snow storage facilities and power generation facilities;
- f) Agricultural <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u>, including silos and grain elevators;

- g) Silos used for industrial uses;
- h) Cooling towers;
- i) flagpoles;
- j) Chimneys and other stacks;
- k) All heating, ventilation and air conditioning equipment (HVAC) that is not enclosed in a <u>mechanical penthouse</u>; and,
- Stair access

4.8.5 SHIPPING CONTAINERS

The temporary placement of one <u>shipping container</u> is permitted per <u>lot</u> associated with low-rise residential <u>uses</u> including those residential <u>uses</u> permitted in the Greenway, Countryside, Hamlet, and Future Development <u>zones</u>, provided the <u>shipping container</u>:

- a) Is located on the <u>driveway</u> or <u>parking pad</u>;
- b) Is not located within a GWY1 zone;
- c) Is set back a minimum of 1.0 metre from any lot line;
- d) Has a maximum <u>height</u> of 2.5 metres, a maximum width of 2.5 metres and a maximum length of 6.0 metres; and
- e) Is not located on the <u>lot</u> for more than 30 days in a calendar year.

4.8.6 OUTDOOR PATIOS

<u>Outdoor Patios</u> are permitted accessory to a non-residential <u>use</u>, subject to the following regulations:

- a) An <u>outdoor patio</u> shall be set back a minimum of 10 metres from a low-rise residential <u>zone</u>; and,
- b) No additional parking shall be required for an <u>outdoor patio</u> where the <u>outdoor patio</u> does not exceed 50% of the <u>gross floor area</u> of the <u>premises</u> it serves.

4.8.7 OUTDOOR DISPLAY AND SALES AREAS

Where an <u>outdoor display and sales area</u> is permitted, the following provisions apply:

- a) The <u>outdoor display and sales area</u> must be accessory to a permitted <u>use</u> on the <u>lot</u>;
- b) The <u>outdoor display and sales area</u> must be set back a minimum of 12.0 metres from a Residential <u>zone</u> boundary;
- c) The <u>outdoor display and sales area</u> must be located outside of any required <u>parking spaces</u>, <u>drive aisles</u>, <u>parking aisles</u>, <u>loading</u> <u>spaces</u>, or required <u>landscaping strips</u>;
- d) Where an <u>outdoor display and sales area</u> is associated with a <u>motor vehicle fueling station</u>, the maximum area of an <u>outdoor display and sales area</u> shall be 200 square metres.
- e) Notwithstanding subsection c) above, where a temporary <u>outdoor</u> <u>display and sales area</u> exists for not more than 12 weeks in a calendar year, it may occupy up to 10% of the required <u>parking spaces</u> (excluding required accessible <u>parking spaces</u> or <u>electric vehicle level 2 charging ready parking spaces</u>) for the <u>uses</u>;
- f) Subsection (d) above shall not apply to an <u>outdoor display and</u> <u>sales area</u> accessory to a <u>motor vehicle sales establishment</u>, a

<u>motor vehicle fueling station</u>, or a <u>motor vehicle rental</u> <u>establishment</u>.

4.8.8 ENCROACHMENTS INTO REQUIRED YARDS (EXCLUDING DECKS AND PORCHES)

Encroachments of the following <u>structures</u> or features attached to a <u>main building</u> are permitted in accordance with the following Table 4.8.8. There is no restriction of the location of gutters into required <u>yards</u>.

- (i) within the RES-ES and RES-ENLR <u>zones</u>, the maximum permitted encroachment into the required <u>interior side yard</u> is 0.45 metres.
- (ii) Notwithstanding the <u>balcony</u> encroachment permission above, within the RES-ES and RES-ENLR <u>zones</u>, the maximum projection of any <u>balcony</u> from the <u>main wall</u> is 1.8 metres.

4.8.9 HARD AND SOFT LANDSCAPING

<u>Hard landscaping</u> and <u>soft landscaping</u> associated with all <u>dwelling units</u> other than <u>apartment dwellings</u>, are subject to the following provisions.

4.8.9.1 HARD LANDSCAPING

a) The maximum area of <u>hard landscaping</u> in the <u>front yard</u> shall not exceed 15%. For the purposes of this Section, <u>driveways</u> and <u>porches</u> with associated stairs are not included in the calculation of <u>hard landscaping</u>;

- b) <u>Hard landscaping</u> may project into the required <u>rear yard</u> a maximum of 50% of the minimum <u>rear yard</u> <u>setback</u> for the <u>main building</u>;
- c) Notwithstanding b) above, <u>hard landscaping</u> may project a maximum of 50% of the required <u>setback</u> of 4.8.2.2 d) i);
- d) Notwithstanding any other provision in Section 4.8.9:
 - (i) a 1.2 metre <u>hard landscaping</u> strip is permitted around swimming pool; and,
 - (ii) a landing consisting of hard landscaping is permitted to project 1.2 metres from the base of the stairs exiting a dwelling unit or deck.

4.8.9.2 SOFT LANDSCAPING

The provisions in this Section are modified to the extent necessary to permit accessory buildings or structures, detached private garages accessed by a lane, coach house dwellings, garden homes and garden suites as permitted by other Sections of this By-law.

- a) The minimum width of a <u>landscaping strip</u> made up of <u>soft</u> <u>landscaping</u> abutting <u>interior side lot lines</u> and <u>rear lot lines</u> on a <u>lot</u> that is not accessed by a <u>lane</u> is:
 - (i) 1.5 metres in the RES-ES (RESIDENTIAL ESTATE), RES-ENLR (RESIDENTIAL ESTABLISHED NEIGHBOURHOOD LOW RISE), GWY2 (GREENWAY TWO), GWY3 (GREENWAY THREE), CTS, (COUNTRYSIDE), and HAM-RES (HAMLET RESIDENTIAL) zones;
 - (ii) 1.2 metres in the RES-LR1 (RESIDENTIAL LOW RISE ONE) zone; and,
 - (iii) 0.6 metres in all other residential low rise <u>zones</u> not accessed by a <u>lane</u>.
- b) The minimum width of a <u>landscaping strip</u> made up of <u>soft</u> <u>landscaping</u> abutting the <u>interior side lot line</u> on a <u>lot</u> that has a detached <u>private garage</u> that is accessed by a <u>lane</u> is 0.6 metres abutting the <u>interior side lot line</u> between the <u>front lot line</u> and

the wall of the detached <u>private garage</u> closest to the <u>main</u> <u>building</u>.

c) Notwithstanding subsections a) and b) above, where a required interior side yard is less than 0.6 metres, the required landscaping strip made up of soft landscaping shall be equal to the required interior side yard for the main building.

4.8.10 PORCHES

<u>Porches</u> associated with low-rise residential <u>uses</u> including those residential <u>uses</u> permitted in the Greenway, Countryside, Hamlet, and Future Development <u>zones</u>, are subject to the following provisions.

4.8.10.1 SIZE OF PORCHES

<u>Porches</u> in the <u>front yard</u> and <u>exterior side yards</u> are permitted provided:

- a) The floor of any <u>porch</u> that is located between a wall of the <u>main</u> <u>building</u> and any <u>lot line</u> that serves as the boundary of a <u>street</u> shall have a depth of at least 1.8 metres;
- b) Notwithstanding subsection a) above, columns, piers, and, or railings associated with the <u>porch</u> are permitted to encroach within this area;
- c) Notwithstanding subsection a) above, stairs can encroach a maximum of 0.3 metres into the minimum required **porch** depth provided a minimum 1.6 metre by 1.6 metre unencumbered area is maintained abutting the door; and,
- d) The maximum <u>height</u> of a <u>porch</u> floor above the <u>average grade</u> level of the <u>porch</u> is 1.2 metres.

4.8.10.2 ENCROACHMENT OF PORCHES INTO REQUIRED YARDS

a) <u>Porches</u> and underground cold cellars located entirely beneath the <u>porch</u>, may encroach:

- (i) Into the required <u>front yard</u> and <u>exterior side yard</u> provided that no part of the <u>porch</u> is located closer than 1.0 metre from the <u>front lot line</u> or <u>exterior side lot line</u>;
- (ii) Into the required <u>rear yard</u> a distance of 3.0 metres, provided it does not extend more than 1.8 metres into the <u>setback</u> area required by <u>Section 4.8.2.2</u> d) i);
- (iii) Into the required <u>interior side yard</u> a distance of 0.2 metres if the required <u>interior side yard</u> is 0.6 metres or less; and,
- (iv) Into the required <u>interior side yard</u> a distance equal to one-half of the required <u>interior side yard</u> where the required <u>interior side yard</u> is greater than 0.6 metres.
- b) Stairs that are used to provide access to a <u>porch</u> from the ground shall not be located closer than 0.6 metres from the <u>front lot line</u> or <u>exterior side lot line</u>.
- c) Eaves associated with a <u>porch</u> are permitted to encroach an additional 0.45 metres beyond what is permitted by subsection (a) above. There is no restriction on the location of gutters.
- d) Notwithstanding subsection a) (i), (ii), (iv) and b) above, in the RES-ES (RESIDENTIAL ESTATE), RES-ENLR (RESIDENTIAL ESTABLISHED NEIGHBOURHOOD LOW RISE), GWY2 (GREENWAY TWO), GWY3 (GREENWAY THREE), CTS, (COUNTRYSIDE), and HAM-RES (HAMLET RESIDENTIAL) zones:
 - (i) <u>Porches</u> and underground cold cellars located entirely beneath the <u>porch</u>, may encroach into the required <u>front</u> <u>yard</u> and <u>exterior side yard</u> by a maximum of 1.8 metres, provided that the underside of the roof of the <u>porch</u> is located not more than 4.5 metres above <u>established grade</u>.
 - (ii) The encroachment of a <u>porch</u> and underground cold cellar into the required <u>interior side yard</u> is not permitted.
 - (iii) Notwithstanding 4.8.10.2 d) (i) above, a <u>porch</u> and underground cold cellar may project a maximum of 0.6 metres beyond an <u>established building line</u>.
 - (iv) Stairs used to access a <u>porch</u> may project 0.45 metres beyond a permitted <u>porch</u> encroachment.

4.8.11 MECHANICAL PENTHOUSES

Notwithstanding the application of <u>height</u> or <u>storey</u> within this By-law, a <u>mechanical penthouse</u> may be exempt from the <u>height</u> or <u>storey</u> requirements provided:

- a) The <u>mechanical penthouse</u> does not project more than 3.5 metres above the highest point of the roof surface, regardless of the <u>height</u> of the <u>building</u>, and does not cover more than 50% of the roof upon which it is located.
- b) Notwithstanding a) above this exemption does not apply to a mechanical penthouse located in the RES-ES (RESIDENTIAL ESTABLISHED NEIGHBOURHOOD LOW RISE) zone.
- c) In all other zones, the <u>height</u> requirements of this By-law shall not apply to a <u>mechanical penthouse</u> that does not project more than 6.0 m metres above the highest point of the roof surface, regardless of the <u>height</u> of the <u>building</u>, and does not cover more than 50% of the roof upon which it is located.
- d) The <u>mechanical penthouse</u> shall not contain any habitable <u>floor</u> <u>area</u>, or any indoor <u>amenity area</u>.

4.9 SPECIAL USE PROVISIONS

4.9.1 HOME OCCUPATIONS

- a) Where a <u>home occupation</u> is permitted, the <u>home occupation</u>:
 - (i) Shall clearly be a secondary <u>use</u> of the <u>lot</u>, and accessory to a <u>dwelling unit</u>;
 - (ii) Shall be conducted entirely within any permitted <u>building</u> on a **lot**;
 - (iii) Shall be conducted by at least one of the residents of a dwelling unit located on the same lot;
 - (iv) Shall not employ more than one employee, in addition to members of the household;
 - (v) Shall not occupy more than 25% of the gross floor area of

- the <u>dwelling unit</u> and any associated <u>accessory building or</u> <u>structure</u> on the same <u>lot</u>;
- (vi) Shall not create noise, vibration, fumes, odour, dust, glare or radiation which is evident outside the <u>dwelling unit</u>;
- (vii) Shall not involve the <u>accessory outdoor storage</u> or outdoor display of materials or finished products;
- (viii) Shall not consist of an occupation that involves the sale of a commodity not produced on the <u>premises</u>. Notwithstanding the above, telephone, mail order, or internet sales of goods is permitted provided products are not picked up on the <u>premises</u>.
- (ix) If involving instructional activity, shall not be occupied by more than four students at any one time;
- If involving a <u>personal service establishment use</u>, shall not be occupied by more than four patrons at any one time; and,
- (xi) Shall not require receipt or delivery of merchandise, goods or equipment by other than a passenger <u>motor vehicle</u> or by parcel or letter carrier mail service using <u>motor vehicles</u> typically employed in residential deliveries.
- b) Notwithstanding the above, the following <u>uses</u> are not <u>home</u> <u>occupations</u> for the purposes of this By-law:
 - (i) Any <u>use</u> involving the storage, repair, maintenance and, or, towing of <u>motor vehicles</u> or other machinery or equipment;
 - (ii) Medical offices, except as set out in sub-section c) below;
 - (iii) Pet services establishments except for aesthetic care;
 - (iv) Kennels;
 - (v) Any <u>use</u> involving the sale of prepared food for human consumption;
 - (vi) Dating bureaus and, or, escort services;
 - (vii) Outdoor storage use or accessory outdoor storage;
 - (viii) Taxi service depot and, or, dispatch;
 - (ix) <u>Home industries</u>;
 - (x) Paint Shop or furniture stripping;
 - (xi) Retail stores; and,
 - (xii) Any <u>use</u> offering temporary overnight accommodation including a <u>bed and breakfast establishment</u> and <u>short</u>

term accommodation.

c) A <u>medical office</u> may be located within the <u>dwelling unit</u> of a physician provided the <u>dwelling unit</u> is located on a <u>lot</u> that has a <u>front lot line</u> or an <u>exterior side lot line</u> that abuts a <u>provincial highway</u>, an <u>arterial road</u>, a <u>major collector road</u> or <u>minor collector road</u> as shown on <u>Maps 10</u> and <u>11</u> of the <u>Official Plan</u>.

4.9.2 PLACE OF WORSHIP

Where a <u>place of worship</u> is permitted in this By-law, the following shall apply:

- a) <u>Accessory uses</u> shall not exceed the <u>gross floor area</u> of the <u>sanctuary;</u>
- b) <u>Accessory uses</u> may include classrooms for the instruction of religious rites, assembly areas with kitchen facilities, a residence for the faith group leader, and offices subordinate and incidental to the <u>place of worship</u> as the <u>principal use</u>;
- c) The <u>gross floor area</u> of a <u>place of worship</u> in a multi-unit <u>building</u> in any Mixed Use or Employment <u>zone</u> shall not exceed 500 square metres.

4.9.3 TEMPORARY TENTS

- a) Temporary tents, marquees and similar <u>structures</u> are permitted to be erected in any non-residential <u>zone</u> for a temporary period not exceeding 12 weeks in any calendar year subject to the following provisions:
 - i) Shall not be located in any landscaping strip; and,
 - ii) Shall not occupy a required accessible <u>parking space</u> or <u>electric vehicle level 2 charging ready parking space</u>.
- b) In addition to a), within any residential <u>zone</u>, temporary tents shall comply with the <u>setbacks</u> and <u>height</u> provisions for <u>accessory</u> <u>buildings or structures</u> and shall not exceed 60 square metres.

c) Provision a) above, does not apply to temporary tents located over a permitted **outdoor patio**.

4.9.4 ACCESSORY WASTE DISPOSAL AREAS

- a) Except for freehold townhouse dwellings, waste generated from all lands zoned RES-LR6 (RESIDENTIAL LOW RISE- SIX), RES-PE (RESIDENTIAL - PUBLIC EDUCATION), Residential Mid-Rise, Residential High Rise, Mixed Use, Commercial, Employment and CF-PW (COMMUNITY FACILITY - PLACE OF WORSHIP) shall be stored inside an enclosed building or structure or deep waste collection receptacle provided the building, structure or waste receptacle:
 - (i) Is located within the <u>interior side yard</u> or <u>rear yard</u>;
 - (ii) Is located no closer to any <u>lot line</u> than required for an <u>accessory building or structure</u> in this By-law;
 - (iii) Does not occupy any required <u>parking spaces</u> and the access to these <u>parking spaces</u>; and,
 - (iv) Is not located within any required <u>landscaping strip</u>.
- b) Minimum size of a waste storage room, or <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> used for waste storage:

(1) Where an expansion is made to an existing <u>building</u>, the minimum size of a waste disposal room only applies to the area of expansion.

4.9.5 TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION AND MODEL HOMES

- a) Nothing in this By-law shall prevent <u>uses</u> incidental to construction, such as a construction camp or other such temporary work camp, tool shed, scaffold, temporary waste disposal receptacle, or other <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> incidental to the construction, only for so long as the same are necessary for work in progress that has neither been finished nor abandoned;
- b) Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the <u>use</u> of land for a <u>model</u> <u>home</u>, provided that the <u>dwelling units</u> to be sold are to be located on lands within the City;
- c) Notwithstanding subsection b) above, the number of model homes within a draft or approved plan of subdivision shall be limited to 25% of the number of dwelling units within the subdivision, to a maximum of ten (10) model home dwelling units; and,

d) Notwithstanding c) above, the maximum number of model home dwelling units may be exceeded where the units are contained within a single building.

4.9.6 MOTOR VEHICLE SALES AND MOTOR VEHICLE RENTAL ESTABLISHMENTS

Where a <u>motor vehicle sales establishment</u>, or a <u>motor vehicle rental</u> <u>establishment</u> is located on a <u>lot</u>, the following provisions apply:

The minimum required width of a landscaping strip shall be:

- (a) 3.0 metres adjacent to any <u>lot line</u> that serves as the boundary of a <u>street</u>; and,
- (b) 6.0 metres adjacent to any other lot line.

4.9.7 MOTOR VEHICLE FUELING STATIONS

Where a <u>motor vehicle fueling station</u> is located on a <u>lot</u>, the following provisions apply:

- a) The minimum required width of a landscaping strip shall be:
 - (i) 3.0 metres adjacent to any <u>lot line</u> that serves as the boundary of a <u>street</u>; and,
 - (ii) 6.0 metres adjacent to any other lot line.
- b) Fuel islands and canopies shall maintain the <u>setback</u> requirements for the <u>main building</u> on a <u>lot</u>.
- c) Notwithstanding any other provisions in the By-law, <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u> associated with a <u>motor vehicle fueling station</u> shall be set back a minimum of 15 metres from a residential <u>zone</u>.
- d) Notwithstanding any other provision in this By-law, no minimum height requirements shall apply to motor vehicle fueling stations.

4.9.8 MOTOR VEHICLE MAINTENANCE SHOP AND MOTOR VEHICLE REPAIR AND BODY SHOP

Where a <u>motor vehicle maintenance shop</u> or <u>motor vehicle repair and</u> <u>body shop</u> is located on a <u>lot</u>, the following provisions apply:

- a) Where <u>accessory outdoor storage</u> is permitted with a <u>motor vehicle maintenance shop</u> or <u>motor vehicle repair and body shop</u>, the <u>accessory outdoor storage</u> is subject to the following:
 - (i) <u>Accessory outdoor storage</u> is permitted only in a <u>rear yard</u> or <u>interior side yard</u> and not closer than 9.0 metres to any <u>lot line</u> that abuts a <u>street</u>;
 - (ii) The <u>height</u> of stored materials shall not exceed the lesser of the <u>height</u> of the <u>main building</u> on the <u>lot</u>, or 12.0 metres;
 - (iii) Opaque fencing with a minimum <u>height</u> of 2.75 metres or a berm with a minimum <u>height</u> of 3.0 metres shall screen the <u>accessory outdoor storage</u>; and,
 - (iv) Accessory outdoor storage is not permitted within any <u>yard</u> abutting a Residential or Mixed Use <u>zone</u> boundary.
- b) Overhead doors providing vehicular access to a <u>building</u> shall not be located within 15 metres of a residential <u>zone</u>.
- c) Notwithstanding any other provisions, <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u> associated with a <u>motor vehicle maintenance shop</u> or <u>motor vehicle repair and body shop</u> shall be set back a minimum of 15 metres from a residential <u>zone</u>.

4.9.9 ADDITIONAL DWELLING UNITS

Two additional <u>dwelling units</u> are permitted in a <u>detached dwelling</u>, <u>semi-detached dwelling</u> or <u>townhouse dwelling</u> provided:

- The additional <u>dwelling units</u> are located entirely within the same <u>building</u> as the <u>detached dwelling</u>, <u>semi-detached dwelling</u> or <u>townhouse dwelling</u>;
- Only one <u>dwelling unit</u> entrance is contained in any <u>main wall</u> facing a <u>street</u> unless the second entrance is located below grade;

- c) Where direct access to the additional <u>dwelling units</u> are provided from the <u>interior side yard</u>, the entrances to the additional <u>dwelling units</u> are required to be a minimum of 1.2 metres from the <u>interior side lot line</u> and no stairs accessing the additional <u>dwelling units</u> are permitted within 1.2 metres from the <u>interior</u> <u>side lot line</u>;
- d) The additional <u>dwelling units</u> are accessed from the <u>street</u> by an unobstructed path of travel that has a minimum width of 1.2 metres; and,
- e) Where an additional <u>dwelling unit</u> is located in a <u>garden home</u>, <u>coach house</u> or other permitted <u>accessory buildings or structure</u>, only one additional <u>dwelling unit</u> is permitted in a <u>detached</u> <u>dwelling</u>, <u>semi-detached dwelling</u> or <u>townhouse dwelling</u>.

4.9.10 GARDEN HOMES

A garden home is permitted accessory to a <u>detached dwelling</u>, <u>semi-detached dwelling</u> or, <u>townhouse dwelling</u> subject to the following:

- A garden home is only permitted within an accessory building or structure in accordance with section 4.8.1, or within an existing legally non-conforming use, accessory building or structure;
- b) There is no <u>coach house</u>, <u>garden suite</u>, or other additional <u>dwelling unit</u> located within an a <u>building</u> accessory to a <u>detached dwelling</u>, <u>semi-detached dwelling</u>, or <u>townhouse dwelling</u> on the <u>lot</u>;
- c) The garden home is located in the rear yard;
- d) The <u>garden home</u> does not exceed the greater of 50% of the <u>gross</u>
 <u>floor area</u> of the <u>principal use dwelling unit</u> on the same <u>lot</u> or 60 square metres;
- e) The garden home is set back a minimum of 6 metres from the main building on the lot;

- f) The garden home has a height of no greater than 4.5 metres;
- g) The <u>garden home</u> is located no further than 30 metres from a <u>lot</u> <u>line</u> abutting a <u>street</u>;
- h) The garden home is accessed from the street by an unobstructed path of travel that has a minimum width of 1.2 metres;
- i) The garden home is located a minimum of:
 - (i) 1.2 metres from the rear lot line;
 - (ii) The required <u>exterior side yard</u> for the <u>main building</u> from the <u>exterior side lot line</u>; and,
 - (iii) 1.2 metres from the interior side lot line.

4.9.11 GARDEN SUITES

Where permitted through the passage of a Temporary Use By-law in accordance with the <u>Planning Act</u>, one <u>garden suite</u> is permitted in a detached <u>accessory building or structure</u> in the <u>rear yard</u> of a <u>lot</u>, provided:

- a) There is no <u>coach house</u> dwelling or <u>garden home</u> on the <u>lot</u>;
- b) The garden suite is in the rear yard;
- c) The <u>garden suite</u> has a maximum <u>gross floor area</u> of 60 square metres provided it does not exceed the <u>gross floor area</u> of the <u>principal use dwelling unit</u> on the same <u>lot</u>;
- d) The garden suite is designed to be portable;
- e) The garden suite is set back a minimum of 6.0 metres from the main building on the lot;
- f) The garden suite has a height of no greater than 4.5 metres;
- g) The garden suite is located no further than 30.0 metres from the lot line over which access from a street is obtained;

- h) The garden suite is accessed from the street by a clear path of travel that has a minimum width of 1.2 metres; and,
- i) The garden suite is located a minimum of:
 - (i) 1.2 metres from the <u>rear lot line</u>;
 - (ii) The required <u>exterior side yard</u> for the <u>main building</u> from the <u>exterior side lot line</u>; and,
 - (iii) 1.2 metres from the interior side lot line.
- j) The garden suite shall be located outside of the Special Policy Area, as identified on Map 8 of the Official Plan.

4.9.12 COACH HOUSE DWELLINGS

Where permitted in this By-law, one <u>coach house</u> dwelling is permitted on a <u>lot</u> provided:

- a) There is no garden home or garden suite on the lot;
- b) The <u>coach house</u> dwelling has a maximum <u>gross floor area</u> of 60 square metres provided it does not exceed the <u>gross floor area</u> of the <u>principal use dwelling unit</u> on the same <u>lot;</u>
- c) The <u>coach house</u> dwelling is on a <u>lot</u> that has a <u>lot frontage</u> of no less than 9.75 metres;
- d) The <u>coach house</u> dwelling is set back a minimum of 6.0 metres from the <u>main building</u> on the <u>lot</u>;
- e) The <u>coach house</u> dwelling is located in a <u>building</u> that has a <u>height</u> of no greater than 8.0 metres; and,
- f) The <u>coach house</u> dwelling is located a minimum of:
 - (i) 0.6 metres from the rear lot line;
 - (ii) The required <u>exterior side yard</u> for the <u>main building</u> from the <u>exterior side lot line</u>; and,
 - (iii) 1.2 metres from the <u>interior side lot line</u> which can be reduced to 0.5 metres if there are no doors or windows on the wall facing the <u>interior side lot line</u> and, reduced to 0

metres if the <u>coach house</u> dwelling shares a common wall with a <u>coach house</u> dwelling or detached <u>private garage</u> on an abutting <u>lot</u>.

PART 5.0 PARKING AND LOADING STANDARDS

5.1 APPLICABILITY OF THIS SECTION

- a) The standards and provisions of this Part of the By-law do not apply to any <u>use</u> in existence on the effective date of this By-law so long as the <u>net floor area</u> that existed on that date is not increased.
- b) Where an existing <u>building</u> is enlarged or altered, or where the <u>use</u> of the <u>building</u> changes, additional <u>parking spaces</u>, accessible <u>parking spaces</u>, <u>electric vehicle parking spaces</u>, <u>bicycle parking spaces</u>, and <u>loading spaces</u> shall be provided for the additional <u>net floor area</u>, as required in this By-law.
- c) If the <u>use</u> of a <u>building</u> changes, additional <u>parking spaces</u> equal to the difference between what exists before the change of <u>use</u> and what is required in this By-law shall be provided.

5.2 GENERAL PARKING PROVISIONS

5.2.1 RESTRICTION ON USE OF LAND, BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES

- a) Unless otherwise specified in this By-law, no person shall use or permit the use of any land, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> in any <u>zone</u> for any purpose permitted in this By-law, unless the minimum number of <u>parking spaces</u> required are provided on the same <u>lot</u> in accordance with the provisions of this By-law.
- b) Notwithstanding the above, the required parking for <u>public uses</u> can be located on an abutting or nearby <u>lot</u> that is also the site of a <u>public use</u>.

5.2.2 CALCULATION OF PARKING REQUIREMENTS

- a) Where the minimum number of <u>parking spaces</u> are calculated on the basis of a rate or ratio, the required number of <u>parking spaces</u> shall be increased to the next highest whole number if the fraction is 0.5 or greater.
- b) Notwithstanding a) above, the minimum number of accessible <u>parking spaces</u> shall be increased to the nearest whole number. For example, 6.25 spaces shall be rounded up to 7 spaces.
- c) In calculating <u>net floor area</u> and <u>gross leasable floor area</u> for the purposes of applying the minimum number of <u>parking spaces</u> required, the <u>net floor area</u> and <u>gross leasable floor area</u> shall not be less than 75% of the <u>gross floor area</u> of a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>.
- d) A <u>car-share parking space</u> is permitted to occupy a required <u>parking space</u>, or <u>electric vehicle charging station parking space</u>, but is not permitted to occupy an accessible <u>parking space</u>.

5.2.3 MORE THAN ONE USE ON A LOT

Unless otherwise specified in this By-law, the <u>parking space</u> requirements for two or more <u>uses</u> on a <u>lot</u> shall be the sum of the requirements for each individual <u>use</u>.

5.2.4 EXCLUSIVE USE OF A PARKING SPACE

Unless otherwise specified in this By-law, all required <u>parking spaces</u> shall be unobstructed and available for parking purposes and used exclusively for that purpose at all times. <u>Parking spaces</u> required by this section of the By-law shall not be used for the storage of inoperable <u>motor vehicles</u>, waste receptacles or snow storage, or for the keeping or storage of <u>motor vehicles</u> for sale, rent, or repair.

5.2.5 SIZE OF PARKING SPACES

a) Each required <u>parking space</u> shall have a width of not less than 2.75 metres and a length of not less than 5.8 metres.

- b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 5.2.5a) above, parking spaces dedicated as accessible parking spaces in accordance with Section 5.6 shall be subject to the following standards:
 - (i) A Type A accessible <u>parking space</u> shall have a width of not less than 3.4 metres and a length of not less than 5.8 metres;
 - (ii) A Type B accessible <u>parking space</u> shall have a width of not less than 2.4 metres and a length of not less than 5.8 metres; and,
 - (iii) A Type A and Type B accessible <u>parking space</u> shall have a 1.5 metre wide access aisle adjacent to the accessible <u>parking space</u>. The 1.5 metre wide access aisle adjacent to an accessible <u>parking space</u> may be shared between two adjacent accessible <u>parking spaces</u>.
- c) Notwithstanding the above, <u>parking areas</u> and <u>parking garages</u> that legally existed on the effective date of this By-law, are exempt from the <u>parking space</u> minimum size requirements as set out in subsection a) and b) above.
- d) <u>Electric vehicle charging stations</u> are permitted to encroach 0.3 metres into a required <u>parking space</u> provided the encroachment is not located further than 1.0 metre from either end of the <u>parking space</u>.

5.2.6 ACCESS TO PARKING SPACES

- a) Direct access shall be provided to each of the <u>parking spaces</u> required in this By-law, unless otherwise specified in this By-law.
- b) Notwithstanding the above, <u>tandem parking spaces</u> are permitted on <u>lots</u> with <u>buildings</u> containing no more than four <u>dwelling units</u> and for condominium <u>townhouse dwellings</u> with parking provided at grade and accessed via a <u>private street</u>.
- c) No more than 6 <u>dead end parking spaces</u> are permitted on a <u>parking aisle</u>.

5.2.7 WIDTH OF PARKING AISLES

The width of <u>parking aisles</u> within a <u>parking area</u> or <u>parking garage</u>, shall be in accordance with the following:

- a) For two-way <u>parking aisles</u>, the minimum unobstructed <u>parking</u> <u>aisle</u> width shall be 6.0 metres.
- b) For one-way <u>parking aisles</u>, the minimum unobstructed <u>parking</u> aisle width shall be 3.0 metres.
- c) Where the <u>parking aisle</u> width in a <u>parking area</u> or <u>parking garage</u> is less than 6.0 metres, the <u>parking aisle</u> shall be one-way.
- d) Notwithstanding the above, <u>parking areas</u> and <u>parking garages</u> that legally existed on the effective date of this By-law are exempt from the minimum <u>parking aisle</u> width requirements set out in subsections a), b) and c) above.

5.2.8 WIDTH OF DRIVE AISLES

- a) <u>Drive Aisles</u> accessing a <u>parking area</u> or <u>parking garage</u>, shall be unobstructed with a minimum of 3.0 metres in width for one-way traffic and a minimum of 6.0 metres in width for two-way traffic.
- b) Where <u>parking spaces</u> are located adjacent to the terminus of a <u>parking aisle</u>, the full width of the <u>drive aisle</u> shall project a minimum of 1.2 metres beyond the adjacent <u>parking spaces</u>.
- c) Notwithstanding the above, a two-way <u>drive aisle</u> located on the same <u>lot</u> as a <u>heritage building</u>, may be reduced to an unobstructed width of 4.0 metres when accessing a <u>parking area</u> or <u>parking garage</u> with ten <u>parking spaces</u> or less and, provided the <u>drive aisle</u> is not a designated fire route.

5.2.9 PARKING GARAGES

a) Where any portion of a <u>parking garage</u> is located more than 1 metre above <u>average grade level</u>, the portion of the <u>parking garage</u> that is 1 metres above <u>average grade level</u> shall be:

- (i) Set back a minimum of 10.0 metres from any lot line;
- (ii) Set back a minimum of 10.0 metres from the <u>main wall</u> of a <u>building</u> nearest to a <u>lot line</u> abutting a <u>street</u>; and,
- (ii) Comply with all other requirements of the <u>main building</u> for the <u>zone</u> in which it is located.
- b) Where no portion of a <u>parking garage</u> is located more than 1 metre above <u>average grade level</u>, the <u>parking garage</u> shall be:
 - (i) Set back a minimum of 0.6 metres from any lot line; and,
 - (ii) Set back a minimum of 3.0 metres from a <u>lot line</u> abutting a residential low rise <u>zone</u> within the first 0.9 metres below <u>average grade level</u>.

5.2.10 SPECIAL PARKING REGULATIONS WITHIN A PARKING GARAGE

Notwithstanding the provisions of section 5.2.5 and 5.2.7, where <u>parking spaces</u> are located within a structured <u>parking garage</u>, the following provisions apply.

- a) Parking space lengths may be reduced to 5.4 metres where the parking aisle is a minimum 6.5 metres in width.
- b) Columns and pipes can encroach into a required <u>parking space</u> by up to 0.3 metres provided the encroachment is no more than 0.5 metres in length, and is not located further than 1.0 metre from either end of the <u>parking space</u>.

5.2.11 SURFACE TREATMENT

- a) All <u>parking spaces</u> and <u>parking areas</u> and all <u>driveways</u>, <u>drive</u> <u>aisles</u>, or <u>parking aisles</u> associated with any <u>parking area</u> must be surface treated with asphalt, concrete, concrete pavers or similar materials.
- b) Notwithstanding a) above, <u>parking spaces</u> and <u>parking areas</u> and all <u>driveways</u>, <u>drive aisles</u>, or <u>parking aisles</u> associated with any <u>parking area</u> in the Greenway, Countryside and Hamlet <u>zones</u> may be treated with an aggregate, to provide a stable surface.

c) The <u>use</u> of sod or other soft landscape areas for the parking of <u>motor vehicles</u> is not permitted.

5.2.12 CHARGING OF A FEE FOR REQUIRED PARKING

- a) Unless otherwise prescribed within this By-law, no charge, fee or payment shall be required for the temporary <u>use</u> of any <u>parking</u> <u>space</u> required in this By-law, except for the following:
 - (i) Commercial Parking Lot or Garage;
 - (ii) A parking lot owned or operated by a public authority;
 - (iii) Public Hospital; and,
 - (iv) Connecting to an electric vehicle charging station

5.2.13 SPECIFIC EXEMPTIONS

Where this Section is specifically referenced in this By-law, any additional parking and loading standards shall not apply to the <u>uses</u> outlined below:

- i) Multiplex Dwellings;
- ii) Detached Dwellings;
- iii) Semi-detached Dwellings:
- iv) Townhouse Dwellings;
- v) Bed and Breakfast Establishments;
- vi) Farm Vacation Homes;
- vii) Agricultural Use, and Agricultural Related Uses;
- viii) Shared Housing Small Scale;
- ix) Shared Housing Supervised Care Home; and,
- x) Group Homes

5.3 ADDITIONAL RESIDENTIAL PARKING REQUIREMENTS

5.3.1 LOCATION OF MOTOR VEHICLE PARKING

- a) The parking of motor vehicles associated with a residential use in a residential zone is only permitted:
 - i) In a parking garage;
 - ii) In a parking area;

- iii) In an attached or detached private garage;
- iv) In a <u>carport</u>;
- v) On a parking pad; and,
- vi) On a **driveway**
- b) For all dwelling types in low rise residential <u>zones</u> requiring two <u>parking spaces</u> per unit, no more than one required <u>parking space</u> may be provided within the required <u>front yard</u> or the required <u>exterior side yard</u> on the <u>lot</u>.

5.3.2 DRIVEWAYS

- Unless otherwise permitted in this By-law, no more than one driveway is permitted to access a <u>lot</u> from a <u>street</u> in a residential zone.
- b) A driveway located in a front yard shall be located:
 - no closer to an <u>interior side lot line</u> than the required <u>interior side yard</u> for the <u>main building</u> from the <u>interior</u> <u>side lot line</u>;
 - ii) no closer to an <u>exterior side lot line</u> than the required <u>exterior side yard</u> for the <u>main building</u> from the <u>exterior</u> <u>side lot line</u>; and,
 - where a <u>private garage</u> is detached from the <u>main</u> <u>building</u>, no closer to the <u>exterior side lot line</u> or <u>interior side lot line</u> than the required <u>setback</u> for the detached <u>private garage</u> from the <u>exterior side lot line</u> or <u>interior side lot line</u>.
- c) A <u>driveway</u> located in an <u>exterior side yard</u> shall be located:
 - (i) no closer to a <u>rear lot line</u> than the required <u>rear yard</u> for the <u>main building</u> from the <u>rear lot line</u>;
 - (ii) no closer to a <u>front lot line</u> than the required <u>front yard</u> for the <u>main building</u> from the <u>front lot line</u>; and,
 - (iii) where a <u>private garage</u> is detached from the <u>main</u> <u>building</u>, no closer to the <u>rear lot line</u> than the required <u>setback</u> for the detached <u>private garage</u> from the <u>rear lot line</u>.

- d) Notwithstanding subsection b) and c) above, the <u>setback</u> for the <u>driveway</u> may be reduced to match the <u>setback</u> of a detached <u>private garage</u> that legally existed on the effective date of this By-law.
- e) The minimum <u>driveway</u> width shall be equal to the <u>garage door</u> width.
- f) The maximum <u>driveway</u> width shall not exceed the <u>garage door</u> width plus 2.0 metres.
- g) Notwithstanding subsection f) above, the maximum <u>driveway</u> width shall not exceed 50% of the <u>lot frontage</u>.
- h) Where a detached <u>private garage</u> is located wholly or partially within the <u>rear yard</u> and is accessed by a <u>driveway</u> crossing the <u>front lot line</u>, the minimum <u>driveway</u> width is 2.5 metres.
- i) Notwithstanding subsections b) and c) above, <u>driveways</u> that legally existed on the effective date of this By-law are exempt from this Section.

5.3.3 CIRCULAR, HORSESHOE AND HAMMERHEAD PROVISIONS

- a) On <u>lots</u> with a <u>lot frontage</u> equal or greater than 16.8 metres, a horseshoe <u>driveway</u> is permitted, subject to the following provisions:
 - (i) The <u>main building</u> is set back at least 8.0 metres from the <u>front lot line</u> or <u>exterior side lot line</u>;
 - (ii) A minimum 7.0 metre separation is provided between the two access points measured at the <u>street</u> line;
 - (iii) The arc portion of the horseshoe <u>driveway</u> has a minimum width of 3.0 metres and a maximum width of 3.7 metres;
 - (iv) The arc portion of the horseshoe <u>driveway</u> connects the <u>street</u> to the other <u>driveway</u> that provides direct access from the <u>street</u>; and,
 - (v) The minimum <u>setback</u> requirements of 5.3.2 shall be maintained.

- b) On <u>lots</u> with a <u>lot frontage</u> equal or greater than 19.2 metres, or on <u>lots</u> with direct access onto a regional road or <u>provincial</u> <u>highway</u>, a hammerhead <u>driveway</u> is permitted in the <u>front yard</u> or <u>exterior side yard</u>, subject to the following provisions:
 - (i) The <u>main building</u> is set back a minimum of 15.0 metres from the <u>front lot line</u> or <u>exterior side lot line</u>;
 - (ii) The hammerhead portion of the <u>driveway</u> shall be:
 - 1) A maximum width of 3.7 metres;
 - 2) Shall not extend more than 4.5 metres from one edge of the <u>driveway</u>;
 - 3) The parking of <u>motor vehicles</u> is not permitted on the hammerhead portion of the <u>driveway</u>; and,
 - 4) Shall have a minimum <u>setback</u> from the <u>front lot</u> <u>line</u> and <u>exterior side lot line</u> of 3.0 metres.
 - (iii) The minimum <u>setback</u> requirements of 5.3.2 shall be maintained.
- c) On <u>lots</u> with a <u>lot frontage</u> equal or greater than 19.2 metres, a circular <u>driveway</u> is permitted in the <u>front yard</u> or <u>exterior side</u> <u>yard</u>, subject to the following provisions:
 - (i) The <u>main building</u> is set back a minimum of 15.0 metres from the <u>front lot line</u> or <u>exterior side lot line</u>;
 - (ii) The arc portion of the circular **driveway** shall be:
 - 1) A minimum width of 3.0 metres and a maximum width of 3.7 metres:
 - 2) Shall have a minimum <u>setback</u> from the <u>front lot</u> <u>line</u> and <u>exterior side lot line</u> of 3.0 metres.
 - (iii) The minimum <u>setback</u> requirements of <u>Section 5.3.2</u> shall be maintained.

5.3.4 PROVISIONS FOR PARKING PADS IN LOW RISE RESIDENTIAL ZONES

5.3.4.1 PARKING PADS ON A LOT ACCESSED BY A STREET

Where there is no <u>private garage</u> associated with a low rise residential <u>dwelling unit</u>, a <u>parking pad</u> is permitted in the <u>front yard</u> or <u>exterior side yard</u>, provided:

- (a) the maximum <u>parking pad</u> width facing the <u>street</u> shall be the greater of:
 - i) 3.7 metres; or,
 - ii) 6.1 metres, provided a minimum 40% soft landscaping is provided in the front yard or exterior side yard in which the parking pad is located.
- (b) Notwithstanding a), in no case shall the width of a <u>parking</u> <u>pad</u> exceed 50% of the <u>lot frontage</u>.

5.3.4.2 PARKING PADS ON A LOT ACCESSED BY A LANE

- a) The parking of motor vehicles on a parking pad between a main building and the rear lot line on a lot accessed by a lane is permitted provided:
 - (i) that at least one <u>parking space</u> is located within a detached <u>private garage</u> that is also accessed by the <u>lane</u> and provided the <u>parking pad</u> is located:
 - no closer than the minimum distance equal to the <u>exterior side yard</u> requirement for the <u>main</u> <u>building</u> from the <u>exterior side lot line</u>; and,
 - 2) no further than 7.2 metres from the rear lot line.
- b) Notwithstanding the above, a <u>parking pad</u> located on a <u>lot</u> accessed by a <u>lane</u> is permitted in conjunction with a <u>private</u> garage attached to a <u>main building</u>, where such a <u>private</u> garage

is expressly permitted in this By-law, provided the <u>parking pad</u> is located:

- (i) no closer than the required <u>exterior side yard</u> for the <u>main</u> <u>building</u> from the <u>exterior side lot line</u>; and,
- (ii) no further than 7.2 metres from the rear lot line.

5.3.5 ACCESS TO PARKING SPACES IN A PRIVATE GARAGE

- a) Where a <u>driveway</u> leads to an attached <u>private garage</u>, the finished floor elevation of the <u>private garage</u> shall be higher than the elevation of the <u>street</u> or <u>lane</u> from which access to the <u>private garage</u> is provided, measured at the midpoint of the <u>driveway</u> where it meets the edge of the right-of-way of the <u>street</u> or <u>lane</u>;
- b) Notwithstanding subsection a) above, where the finished floor elevation of the <u>first storey</u> of a <u>dwelling unit</u> is lower in elevation than the midpoint of the <u>driveway</u> where it meets the <u>street</u> or <u>lane</u> from which access to the <u>private garage</u> is provided, the finished floor elevation of an attached <u>private garage</u> shall be a maximum of 1.0 metre below the finished floor elevation of the <u>first storey</u> of the <u>dwelling unit</u>; and,
- c) Notwithstanding subsections a) and b) above, <u>private garages</u> that legally existed on the effective date of this By-law are exempt from this Section.

5.3.6 PARKING SPACES IN PRIVATE GARAGES

Where <u>parking spaces</u> are located in a <u>private garage</u>, the following provisions apply:

a) A <u>private garage</u> intended to occupy a single <u>motor vehicle</u> shall be a minimum of 3.0 metres in width and 6.0 metres in length. For each additional required <u>parking space</u>, the <u>private garage</u> width shall increase by 2.75 metres.

- b) For <u>lots</u> with a <u>lot frontage</u> of less than 18 metres, the maximum width of a <u>private garage</u> shall not exceed the maximum <u>garage</u> <u>door</u> width plus 1.0 metre.
- c) Within the <u>private garage</u>, stair encroachments into the <u>parking spaces</u> required in subsection a) above, are permitted provided that the size of each <u>parking space</u> is no less than 5.4 metres in length and 2.6 metres in width and has a vertical clearance of at least 2.1 metres.
- d) Notwithstanding subsections a) and b) and c) above, <u>private</u> garages that legally existed on the effective date of this By-law are exempt from this Section.

5.3.7 MINIMUM NUMBER OF PARKING SPACES REQUIRED

The number of <u>parking spaces</u> required for residential <u>uses</u> shall be calculated in accordance with the standards set out in Table 5.3.7 below.

Special Provisions: Table 5.3.7

(1)	Where accessed by a <u>private street</u> an additional 0.25 spaces per unit is to be provided for visitor parking.
(2)	Visitor parking shall not be located on any lands intended solely for the exclusive use of an individual residential unit in a development.
(3)	Visitor parking shall not be located as tandem parking spaces.
(4)	Accessible parking in accordance with <u>Section 5.2.5b</u>) and <u>Section 5.6</u> of this By-law shall be provided as a percentage of the required visitor parking only.
(5)	Where an additional <u>dwelling unit</u> is located on the same <u>lot</u> within a <u>detached</u> <u>dwelling</u> , <u>semi-detached dwelling</u> , or <u>townhouse dwelling</u> , the required parking for the <u>detached dwelling</u> , <u>semi-detached dwelling</u> , or <u>townhouse dwelling</u> is reduced to one (1) space.

5.4 NON-RESIDENTIAL PARKING REQUIREMENTS

5.4.1 MINIMUM NUMBER OF PARKING SPACES REQUIRED

The number of <u>parking spaces</u> required for non-residential <u>uses</u> shall be calculated in accordance with the standards set out in Table 5.4.1.

5.4.2 SHARED PARKING PROVISIONS

Notwithstanding the minimum non-residential <u>parking space</u> requirements set out in Tables under <u>Sections 5.3</u>, <u>5.4</u>, and <u>5.5</u>, the parking requirements may be reduced if the <u>lot</u> is used for two or more separate <u>uses</u> in accordance with Table 5.4.2 below.

To determine the parking requirement for such a <u>building</u> or <u>lot</u>, the total parking required for each <u>use</u> type is multiplied by the occupancy rates below, and the individual sums determined for each of the morning, noon, afternoon and evening periods. The largest of these sums shall be the minimum parking requirement for the <u>uses</u> on the <u>lot</u>. If a <u>use</u> is listed in <u>Section 5.4.1</u> of this By-law but is not listed in this Section, the parking requirement for the <u>use</u> is as required in <u>Section 5.4.1</u>.

5.5 ALTERNATE PARKING STANDARDS

Alternate parking standards are designed to apply to Key Development Areas (KDAs) and, Major Transit Station Areas (MTSAs) as shown on Map 1 – Markham Structure and Map 2 – Centres and Corridors and Transit Network in the Official Plan, or other areas deemed appropriate through a Zoning By-law Amendment.

The provisions of this Section only applies through site specific amendment, or where specified within this By-law.

5.5.1 MINIMUM NUMBER OF PARKING SPACES REQUIRED FOR RESIDENTIAL USES

The number of <u>parking spaces</u> required for residential <u>uses</u> shall be calculated in accordance with the standards set out in Table 5.5.1 below.

5.7.2 PERCENTAGE OF ACCESSIBLE PARKING SPACES AS ELECTRIC VEHICLE PARKING SPACES

No more than 50% of the required accessible <u>parking spaces</u> may contain an <u>electric vehicle charging station</u>.

Where more than 6 accessible <u>parking spaces</u> are required by this Bylaw, a minimum of one (1) accessible <u>parking space</u> shall also contain an <u>electric vehicle charging station</u>.

5.7.3 EXCEPTIONS TO ELECTRIC VEHICLE PARKING

- a) Notwithstanding <u>Table 5.7.1.</u>, the requirement for <u>electric vehicle</u> <u>parking spaces</u> shall not apply to the <u>uses</u> identified in <u>Section 5.2.13</u>.
- b) Notwithstanding the provisions contained in <u>Section 5.1</u>, <u>Section 5.7</u> does not apply to any <u>building</u> that legally existed on the effective date of this By-law.
- c) Where an addition to a <u>building</u>, or a change of <u>use</u> within a <u>building</u> requires the provision of additional <u>parking spaces</u> in accordance with this By-law, the provisions of <u>Table 5.7.1</u> shall only apply to any additional <u>parking spaces</u> required by this By-law.

5.8.3 REQUIREMENTS FOR LOADING SPACES

Where a **loading space** is provided, the following regulations apply:

- a) A <u>loading space</u> is not permitted:
 - (i) In any front yard; and,
 - (ii) Between the <u>main wall</u> closest to the <u>exterior side lot line</u> and the <u>exterior side lot line</u>.
- b) Minimum <u>setback</u> of a <u>loading space</u> from a residential or mixed use <u>zone</u>:
 - i) 15 metres when located within an employment or commercial zone; and,
 - ii) 7.5 metres when located within any other zone
- c) Access to <u>loading spaces</u> must be by means of a <u>drive aisle</u> or <u>parking aisle</u> that is at least 6.0 metres wide within the <u>lot</u> on which the <u>loading spaces</u> are located.
- d) All vehicular movements required to access the <u>loading space</u> must be on private property.

5.9 BICYCLE PARKING SPACE REQUIREMENTS

5.9.1 GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR BICYCLE PARKING

Where <u>bicycle parking spaces</u> are required by this By-law, the following provisions apply:

a) <u>Bicycle Parking Spaces</u> apply only to <u>buildings</u> where the total <u>gross floor area</u> of all non-residential <u>uses</u> on a single <u>lot</u> is greater than 2,000 square metres.

- b) Where a required <u>bicycle parking space</u> is located wholly within a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>, it shall be subject to the following requirements:
 - i) A required <u>bicycle parking space</u> shall have direct access from an interior communal area of a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u>; and.
- c) The minimum width of an aisle providing unobstructed access to a bicycle parking space shall be 1.5 m.
- d) The minimum dimensions of a <u>bicycle parking space</u> are as follows:
 - i) Length 1.8 m;
 - ii) Width 0.6 m; and,
 - iii) Vertical clearance 1.2 m.
- e) Notwithstanding the minimum dimensions noted in d), where a <u>long term bicycle parking space</u> is located on a wall, the dimensions above may be oriented vertically.

5.9.2 MINIMUM NUMBER OF REQUIRED BICYCLE PARKING SPACES

a) The minimum number of <u>bicycle parking spaces</u> required shall be calculated in accordance with the standards set out in Table 5.9.2 below.

- b) A <u>long-term bicycle parking space</u> required for a <u>dwelling unit</u> shall be located within the following areas of a <u>building</u>:

- i) Within the first or second **storey**; or,
- ii) Any **storey** located below grade.

5.9.4 SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR SHORT TERM BICYCLE PARKING

- a) A <u>short-term bicycle parking space</u> shall be located in the following areas:
 - i) Wholly within a <u>building</u> in which the <u>principal use</u> is located and for which the <u>short-term bicycle parking</u> <u>space</u> is required; or,
 - ii) In any <u>yard</u>, provided the <u>short-term bicycle parking space</u> is wholly open and unenclosed.
- b) Where a short-term bicycle parking space is located in a yard, it shall be permitted to be located in a required yard, subject to the following:
 - i) A <u>short-term bicycle parking space</u> shall have a minimum <u>setback</u> of 0.6 metres from the nearest <u>lot line</u>.
 - ii) A <u>short-term bicycle parking space</u> shall have a minimum <u>setback</u> of 3.0 metres from a <u>parking area</u>.
- c) Where a <u>short-term bicycle parking space</u> is located wholly within a <u>building</u>, the following additional requirements shall apply:
 - i) A <u>short-term bicycle parking space</u> located wholly within a <u>building</u> shall be located within the <u>first storey</u>; and,
 - ii) A <u>short-term bicycle parking space</u> shall have direct access from the exterior of a <u>building</u>.

DRIVE-THROUGH SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS

5.10.1 MINIMUM LOT AREA

The minimum <u>lot area</u> for a <u>drive-through service establishment</u> is 0.3 hectares.

5.10.2 STACKING SPACE REQUIREMENTS

<u>Stacking spaces</u> are required for all <u>drive-through service establishments</u> and shall be exclusive of any other <u>parking space</u>, <u>loading space</u>, <u>drive</u> <u>aisle</u> and <u>parking aisle</u> requirements contained within this By-law.

5.10.3 STACKING SPACE DIMENSIONS

Stacking spaces shall have:

- a) A minimum unobstructed width of 3.0 metres; and,
- b) A minimum unobstructed length of 6.5 metres.

5.10.4 MINIMUM NUMBER OF STACKING SPACES

The minimum number of required <u>stacking spaces</u> per <u>drive-through</u> <u>service establishment</u> shall be provided in accordance with Table 5.10.4.

5.10.5 SETBACKS FROM RESIDENTIAL ZONE BOUNDARY

<u>Stacking spaces</u> shall be set back a minimum of 15.0 metres to any Residential <u>zone</u> boundary.

5.10.6 LOCATION OF DRIVE-THROUGH SERVICE ESTABLISHMENT COMPONENTS

No <u>stacking spaces</u> associated with a <u>drive-through service</u> <u>establishment</u> shall be located in any minimum required <u>yard</u>.

5.11 SPECIAL MOTOR VEHICLES

5.11.1 PARKING OF COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES

The following provisions apply to the parking or storage of <u>commercial</u> motor vehicles:

- a) Within any low-rise residential zone, the owner or occupant of a dwelling unit may use a parking space for the purposes of parking or storage of one commercial motor vehicle that does not exceed any of the following:
 - i) A length of 5.8 metres;
 - ii) A width of 2.75 metres;
 - iii) A height of 3.0 metres; or,
 - iv) A manufacturers identified maximum gross vehicle weight rating of 4600 kg.
- b) Within a countryside <u>zone</u>, the owner or occupant of a permitted <u>use</u> within the <u>zone</u> may use a <u>parking space</u> for the purposes of parking or storage of one <u>commercial motor vehicle</u> that exceeds the restrictions identified in <u>Section 5.11.1</u> a), provided:
 - i) It is located in the interior side yard or rear yard;
 - ii) It is set back no closer than 6.0 metres from the interior

side lot line or rear lot line; and

- iii) Is located on a stable surface as per <u>Section 5.2.11</u>.
- c) Within any non-residential <u>zone</u>, the owner or occupant of a permitted <u>use</u> within the <u>zone</u> may park a <u>commercial motor</u> <u>vehicle</u> that exceeds the restrictions identified in <u>Section 5.11.1</u> a), provided:
 - i) It is located in the <u>interior side yard</u> or <u>rear yard</u>;
 - ii) It does not occupy a required <u>parking space</u>; <u>landscaping</u> area, <u>drive isle</u> or <u>parking isle</u>; and
 - iii) Is located on a stable surface as per <u>Section 5.11.1</u>.
- d) Unless otherwise identified in this By-law, the parking or storage of <u>commercial motor vehicles</u> are not permitted in any Greenway <u>zone</u>, Open Space <u>zone</u>, Future Development <u>zone</u>, Transportation and Utilities <u>zone</u>, Parkway Belt West <u>zone</u> or Overlay <u>zone</u>.

5.11.2 PARKING OF RECREATIONAL MOTOR VEHICLES

The following provisions apply to the parking or storage of <u>recreational</u> motor vehicles:

- a) Recreational motor vehicles may be stored in the interior side yard and rear yard on a lot provided that, if the recreational motor vehicle has a height of 1.8 metres or more, it shall be located no closer than 1.2 metres from any lot line.
- (b) Recreational motor vehicles may be parked or stored in the front yard or exterior side yard on a lot provided they are parked or stored on a driveway and they are located no closer than 9.0 metres from the edge of the paved surface of any public street.
- (c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) and (b) above, the temporary parking of <u>recreational motor vehicles</u> is permitted on a <u>lot</u> within 9.0 metres of a public <u>street</u> for a maximum of 14 continuous days provided that it is located no closer than 0.6 metres from the closest edge of a sidewalk, or the closest edge of the curb of the public <u>street</u> if there is no sidewalk, if the <u>recreational motor vehicle</u> or has a height of 1.0 metre or more at this location.

d) Unless otherwise identified in this By-law, the parking or storage of <u>recreational motor vehicles</u> are not permitted in any Commercial <u>zone</u>, Employment <u>zone</u>, Greenway <u>zone</u>, Open Space <u>zone</u>, Future Development <u>zone</u>, Transportation and Utilities <u>zone</u>, Parkway Belt West <u>zone</u> or Overlay <u>zone</u>.

PART 6.0 RESIDENTIAL ZONES

6.1 ZONES

The provisions of this Section apply in addition to all relevant general provisions in <u>Part 4.0</u> of this By-law.

6.2 ADDITIONAL GENERAL PROVISIONS

The provisions of this section apply in addition to all relevant general provisions in <u>Part 4.0</u> of this By-law.

6.2.1 MAXIMUM OUTSIDE WALL HEIGHT

Where this By-law specifies a maximum <u>outside wall height</u>, the following provisions apply:

- a) Pitched roofs with a slope of not less than 25 degrees may project a maximum of 3.0 metres above the maximum permitted <u>outside</u> <u>wall height</u>. For the purposes of this provision, up to 10% of the roof area may have a slope less than 25 degrees;
- Except as indicated in provision a) above, any other architectural feature or roof <u>structure</u> with a pitch of less than 25 degrees, can project a maximum of 1.0 metre above the maximum <u>outside wall</u> <u>height</u>;
- c) Notwithstanding subsections a) and b) above, the maximum projection for a hip or gable roof with a slope greater than 25 degrees may be increased to the average of the highest points of the two neighbouring lots;
- d) <u>Dormers</u> are permitted provided that the sum total of the <u>dormers</u> widths from outside wall to outside wall of the <u>dormer</u> shall not occupy more than 35% of the width of the roof length on which they are located;
- e) <u>Dormers</u> are not permitted within a roofline or wall facing or abutting an <u>interior side lot line</u>;
- f) Ornamental roof construction features such as unoccupied towers, steeples, or cupolas, as well as skylights, chimneys and other stacks are permitted to project above the maximum <u>outside</u> <u>wall height</u>.

6.2.2 BREEZEWAYS

A <u>breezeway</u> is permitted on a <u>lot</u> with a detached <u>private garage</u> that is accessed by a <u>lane</u> provided:

- a) The <u>breezeway</u> is no wider than 2.75 metres with the width being measured from the exterior faces of the exterior walls;
- b) The <u>height</u> of a <u>breezeway</u> does not exceed 3.3 metres;
- c) If a <u>breezeway</u> is located on a <u>corner lot</u> it is not located any closer to an <u>exterior side lot line</u> than the minimum distance equal to the required <u>exterior side yard</u> for the <u>main building</u> from the <u>exterior side lot line</u>;
- d) If a <u>breezeway</u> is located on an <u>interior lot</u>, it is set back a minimum of 0.5 metres from the <u>interior side lot line</u>. Notwithstanding this provision, a <u>breezeway</u> may share a common wall with another <u>breezeway</u> on an abutting <u>lot</u> and no <u>setback</u> from the <u>interior side lot line</u> is required on that side of the <u>lot</u>; and,
- e) Notwithstanding any other provision in this By-law, no part of a breezeway is part of the main building or the accessory building or structure on a lot.

The Residential - Estate (RES-ES) <u>zone</u> applies to lands within the 'Residential Estate' designation shown on <u>Map 3</u> of the <u>Official Plan</u>. The lands in the RES-ES <u>zone</u> are the site of existing subdivisions with <u>detached dwellings</u> on large <u>lots</u>. The intent of the RES-ES <u>zone</u> is to retain the landscape character established by the pattern of <u>lot</u> sizes and to ensure that any proposed changes to <u>buildings</u> reflect the pattern of development already established in the area.

The Residential - Established Neighbourhood Low Rise (RES-ENLR) <u>zone</u> applies to those lands within the 'Residential Low Rise' designation shown on <u>Map 3</u> of the <u>Official Plan</u> that were generally developed before 1996.

This <u>zone</u> seeks to establish a predictable set of standards that focuses on the exterior massing of a <u>building</u> that forms the <u>main building coverage</u> while also allowing variation in architectural form. The <u>zone</u> also seeks to ensure that while new residential infill developments are sympathetic to the established character of these neighbourhoods, the reinvestment and evolution of these areas of the <u>City</u> is also facilitated.


The Official Plan anticipates infill development and redevelopment and therefore, the intent of the RES-ENLR zone is to ensure that such infill development generally respects and reflects the existing pattern and character of adjacent development.





Consistent with the <u>Official Plan</u>, the minimum <u>height</u> of <u>buildings</u> in the RES-HR(IA) <u>zone</u> remains at three <u>storevs</u>.





The Mixed Use - Heritage Main Street - Thornhill (MU-HMS (T)) <u>zone</u> applies to lands within the 'Mixed Use Heritage Main Street' designation shown on <u>Map 3</u> of the <u>Official Plan</u>. The lands within this <u>zone</u> are located along the eastern side of Yonge Street in the historic Village of Thornhill.

This Mixed Use Heritage Main Street area offers a traditional shopping experience for residents and visitors in an historic main <u>street</u> setting where at-grade <u>uses</u> are predominantly retail. Opportunities for residential <u>uses</u> exist above the <u>first storey</u> of <u>buildings</u>. Exclusively residential <u>buildings</u> are not permitted on lands abutting Yonge or John Streets. The area represents opportunities for residents and visitors to engage in a unique experience that is not typically experienced in newer shopping and dining areas. The <u>zone</u> permits a wide array of pedestrian-oriented non-residential <u>uses</u> at-grade that contributes to the animation of this historic area.

The Mixed Use - Heritage Main Street - Unionville (MU-HMS (U)) zone applies to lands within the 'Mixed Use Heritage Main Street' designation shown on Map 3 of the Official Plan. The lands within this zone are located along the historic Main Street area of the Village of Unionville.

This Mixed Use Heritage Main Street area offers a broad shopping, dining and cultural experience which is intended to appeal to both local residents and the wider Markham community as well as a certain segment of the tourist market. The historic Mixed Use village dates back to the early 1840s and attracts thousands of visitors each year for its shopping and dining experiences offered in a unique setting and enhanced due to the intact, well preserved and protected historic village. The zone permits a variety of pedestrian oriented retail, office, service and restaurant uses at-grade that contributes to the unique quality of this well-known historic area.

8.2 ADDITIONAL GENERAL PROVISIONS

The provisions of this Section apply in addition to all relevant general provisions in <u>Part 4.0</u> of this By-law.

8.2.1 ACCESSORY BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES IN THE COMMERCIAL ZONE

Notwithstanding <u>Section 4.8.1</u>, <u>accessory buildings or structures</u> are permitted in the Commercial <u>zone</u> subject to the following provisions:

- a) Accessory buildings or structures shall not be erected on a <u>lot</u> prior to the erection of the <u>main building</u> on the <u>lot</u>;
- b) <u>Accessory buildings or structures</u> shall not be erected within a <u>public easement</u>;
- Accessory buildings or structures shall not be erected within a <u>front</u> yard or <u>exterior side yard</u>;
- d) <u>Accessory buildings or structures</u> shall not be erected within 15.0 metres of a Residential or Mixed Use <u>zone</u> boundary;
- e) Accessory buildings or structures shall not have a height greater than 7.5 metres;

- f) Accessory buildings or structures shall be set back a minimum of 1.2 metres from an interior side lot line or rear lot line; and,
- g) Accessory buildings or structures shall not be erected within 1.8 metres of a main building.

8.2.2 ACCESSORY INDUSTRIAL EQUIPMENT IN THE COMMERCIAL ZONE

Accessory Industrial Equipment shall not be located within or on:

- a) A public easement;
- b) A <u>lot</u> prior to the erection of the <u>main building</u> on the <u>lot</u>;
- c) A <u>front yard</u>;
- d) A minimum exterior side yard required in this By-law; and
- e) 15.0 metres of a Residential or Mixed Use **zone** boundary.

8.2.3 LANDSCAPING STRIP REQUIREMENT IN THE COMMERCIAL ZONE

- a) <u>Landscaping strips</u> in the Commercial <u>zone</u> are required to be:
 - (i) A minimum of 3.0 metres wide adjacent to any <u>lot line</u> that serves as the boundary of a <u>street</u>; and,

The Commercial (COM) <u>zone</u> applies to lands within the 'Commercial' designation shown on <u>Map 3</u> of the <u>Official Plan</u>.

The Commercial designation primarily applies to certain lands that accommodate existing large-format retail development serving a wide area. It is the intent of the <u>Official Plan</u> to provide for the evolution of lands within the Commercial designation to more intensive <u>building</u> forms for office, retail and service <u>uses</u>, while remaining compatible with adjacent land <u>uses</u>.

In order to implement the Official Plan, the COM zone permits a wide range of commercial uses that are subject to standards that are intended to establish a more urban form.

9.2 SPECIFIC USE PROVISIONS

9.2.1 RESTRICTIONS ON THE LOCATION OF CANNABIS RELATED USES

Cannabis related <u>uses</u> are only permitted in a single <u>use building</u> and no outdoor cultivation, storage or processing is permitted. In addition, the <u>lot</u> on which the <u>use</u> is located is required to be set back a minimum of 150.0 metres from a <u>lot</u> that is the site of a:

- a) College;
- b) <u>Community centre</u>;
- c) Child care centre;
- d) **Dwelling unit**;
- e) Group Home;
- f) Long term care home;
- g) Place of worship;
- h) Public park;
- i) Public school;

- j) Private park;
- k) **Private school**;
- l) <u>Retirement home</u>;
- m) Trade and convention centre; and,
- n) <u>University</u>.

9.3 ADDITIONAL GENERAL PROVISIONS

The provisions of this Section apply in addition to all relevant general provisions in Part 4.0 of this By-law.

9.3.1 ACCESSORY OUTDOOR STORAGE

Where <u>accessory outdoor storage</u> is permitted in an Employment <u>zone</u>, the following provisions apply:

- a) Accessory outdoor storage shall be permitted only in a <u>rear yard</u> or <u>interior side yard</u> and shall be located no closer than 9.0 metres to any <u>lot line</u> that abuts a <u>street</u>.
- b) The height of stored materials shall not exceed the lesser of the <u>height</u> of the <u>main building</u> on the <u>lot</u>, or 12.0 metres.
- c) Opaque fencing with a minimum height of 2.75 metres or a berm with a minimum height of 3.0 metres shall screen the <u>accessory</u> outdoor storage.
- d) <u>Accessory outdoor storage</u> is not permitted within any <u>yard</u> abutting a Residential or Mixed Use <u>zone</u> boundary.

9.3.2 ACCESSORY BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES IN EMPLOYMENT ZONES

Notwithstanding <u>Section 4.8.1</u>, <u>accessory buildings or structures</u> located in all Employment <u>zones</u> are subject to the following provisions:

 a) Accessory buildings or structures shall not be erected on a <u>lot</u> prior to the erection of the <u>main building</u> on the <u>lot</u>;

- b) <u>Accessory buildings or structures</u> shall not be erected within a public easement;
- Accessory buildings or structures shall not be erected within a <u>front</u> yard or <u>exterior side yard</u>;
- d) Accessory buildings or structures shall not be erected within 15.0 metres of a Residential or Mixed Use zone boundary;
- e) Accessory buildings or structures shall not have a height greater than 7.5 metres;
- f) Accessory buildings or structures shall be set back a minimum of 1.2 metres from an interior side lot line or rear lot line;
- g) Accessory buildings or structures shall not be erected within 1.8 metres of a main building;
- h) The maximum permitted gross floor area of all accessory buildings or structures is 20 square metres;
- i) <u>Accessory buildings or structures</u> shall be used for storage, and shall not be occupied for the carrying out of the primary <u>use</u> of the property.

9.3.3 ACCESSORY INDUSTRIAL EQUIPMENT

Accessory Industrial Equipment related to any permitted use shall not be:

- a) located within a **public easement**;
- b) located on a <u>lot</u> prior to the erection of the <u>main building</u> on the <u>lot</u>;
- c) located within a **front yard**;
- d) located within a minimum <u>exterior side yard</u> required in this By-law;
- e) located on required parking spaces; and

f) located within 15.0 metres of a Residential or Mixed Use zone boundary.

9.3.4 LANDSCAPING STRIP REQUIREMENTS

- a) <u>Landscaping strips</u> in any Employment <u>zone</u> are required to be:
 - (i) A minimum of 3.0 metres wide adjacent to any <u>lot line</u> that abuts a <u>street</u>;
 - (ii) A minimum of 3.0 metres wide abutting an <u>interior side lot</u> <u>line</u> and <u>rear lot line</u>; and,
 - (iii) A minimum of 6.0 metres wide adjacent to any <u>lot line</u> that abuts a Residential or Mixed Use **zone** boundary.

The General Employment designation is characterized by large properties to accommodate single and multiple unit manufacturing, processing and warehousing <u>uses</u> and accessory office, retail or service <u>uses</u>. Consistent with the <u>Official Plan</u>, the preservation of this designation from incompatible and, or sensitive land <u>uses</u> and other non-industrial <u>uses</u> is of importance.



The Employment - Service Employment (EMP-SE) <u>zone</u> applies to lands within the 'Service Employment' designation shown on <u>Map 3</u> of the <u>Official Plan</u>.

Lands zoned Service Employment (EMP-SE) are intended to accommodate <u>uses</u> that serve and support other business <u>uses</u> and also applies to lands in older employment areas that have been transitioning from <u>industrial uses</u> to small-scale office and service employment <u>uses</u>. Service employment <u>uses</u> are typically suited to locations in shared multiple unit <u>buildings</u>. These <u>uses</u> provide goods and services to the businesses in Markham's employment areas, but may also serve residents' needs.

In order to implement the Official Plan, the EMP-SE zone permits a wide range of business uses in multiple building types.

As Markham continues to grow, much of the new major office development will be established on lands zoned 'Business Park Office Priority Employment'. Multi-storey office buildings and the redevelopment of existing industrial sites to office uses is encouraged in this zone. Permitting structured parking areas and commercial parking lots or garages will assist in supporting higher employment densities in this zone.

In order to implement the Official Plan, the EMP-BP (O) zone permits a more limited range of employment uses than the EMP-BP zone focusing more on office uses.

10.2.1.2 EXISTING LOTS

Notwithstanding any other provision in this By-law, a detached dwelling is

permitted on a <u>lot</u> that existed on the date that the Greenbelt Plan came into force on December 16, 2004, provided the <u>lot</u> was zoned to permit the <u>use</u> on December 16, 2004.

10.2.2 HOME INDUSTRY

No more than 2% to a maximum of 2,000 square metres (0.2 ha) of the <u>lot</u> <u>area</u> shall be used for a <u>home industry</u> including but not limited to, <u>buildings</u> or <u>structures</u>, <u>parking areas</u> and all components used exclusively for the <u>home industry</u>.

A <u>home industry</u> may be carried on in whole or in a part of an <u>accessory</u> <u>building or structure</u>.



- (2) Only permitted as an accessory use to a place of worship

The Community Facility - Place of Worship (CF-PW) zone applies to lands that are the site of places of worship. In accordance with Section 8.13.7 of the Official Plan, the CF-PW zone only recognizes existing places of worship and vacant place of worship sites. No additions to existing places of worship are permitted unless Council passes an amendment to this By-law to permit an addition.

12.2 SPECIFIC USE PROVISIONS

12.2.1 FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

Lands zoned Future Development (FD) are predominantly identified as Future Urban Area in the Official Plan. The Future Development zone only recognizes existing legal uses and buildings within the zoning designation. A Zoning By-law Amendment would be required to properly assess the merits of any redevelopment of these lands into the appropriate land use designations.

12.2.2 TRANSPORTATION AND UTILITIES

Lands zoned Transportation and Utilities are intended for the provision of corridors for transportation facilities, particularly highways and railways, and utility lines including hydroelectric transmission, gas and oil pipelines, telephone and any other cable services. In the case of transmission corridors, additional secondary <u>uses</u> are to be permitted including <u>stormwater management facilities</u>, district cooling and heating facilities, trails and linear parks, <u>community gardens</u> and <u>agricultural uses</u>, appropriate naturalized low-maintenance <u>landscaping</u> and transportation. In the case of other utility corridors additional secondary <u>uses</u> are to be permitted including open space, natural heritage areas, trails, <u>community gardens</u> and <u>agricultural uses</u>. These <u>uses</u> shall be compatible with surrounding land <u>uses</u>.

12.2.3 PARKWAY BELT WEST

Lands identified within the Parkway Belt West shall be governed by the provincial land <u>use</u> regulation made under the <u>Parkway Belt Planning and Development Act</u>, as amended, or zoning by-laws passed by <u>Council</u> and acceptable to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing.

12.3.3.1 Permitted Uses

a) Uses permitted in the Parkway Belt West Plan per Ontario Regulation 473/73

The Parkway Belt West Plan was implemented in 1978 to create a multi-purpose utility corridor, urban separator and linked open space system. The primary effect of the plan is to designate and protect land needed for linear regional <u>infrastructure</u> such as transit, utility and electric power facility corridors.

The <u>City</u> is the approval authority for all Site Plan applications in the <u>zone</u> and the Province is the approval authority for all permitted <u>uses</u>.




Notwithstanding any other provision in this By-law, the following <u>uses</u> are prohibited on lands within a Special Policy Area (Flood Plain) as shown on Schedule "B" to this By-law:

- e) <u>Essential emergency services</u> such as police, fire stations, ambulance dispatch and electrical substations;

- i) Motor vehicle repair and body shops;
- j) Motor vehicle maintenance shops;

- a) Notwithstanding any other provision in this By-law, the following <u>uses</u> are prohibited on lands within the Oak Ridges Moraine High Aquifer Vulnerability (ORM-HAV) <u>zone</u> as shown on Schedule "C" to this By-law:
 - i) Generation and storage of <u>hazardous waste</u> or <u>liquid</u> industrial waste (ORM);
 - ii) Waste disposal sites and facilities, organic soil conditioning sites and snow storage and disposal facilities;
 - Underground and above-ground storage tanks that not equipped with an approved secondary containment device; and,
 - iv) Storage of contaminants listed in <u>Schedule 3 (Severely Toxic Contaminants)</u> to <u>Regulation 347 of the Revised Regulations of Ontario.</u>

- b) Within the Oak Ridges Moraine Landform Conservation (ORM-LC) zone as shown on Schedule "C" to this By-law:
 - (i) the <u>net developable area</u> of the site that is disturbed shall not exceed 50 per cent of the total area of the site; and,
 - (ii) the <u>net developable area</u> of the site that has <u>impervious</u> <u>surfaces</u> shall not exceed more than 20 per cent of the total area of the site.

17.2 DEFINITIONS

The definitions below only apply to the **zones** that have been established in <u>Part 17</u> of this By-law and each definition is followed by (ORM) for convenience purposes. Where a term is defined in <u>Part 17</u>, but not listed in this section, reference shall be made to <u>Part 3</u> of this By-law for the definition.

Home Business (ORM) means a business that is not located on a farm that:

- (a) Involves providing personal or professional services or producing custom or artisanal products,
- (b) Is carried on as a small-scale secondary <u>use</u> within a single dwelling, or a <u>building</u> that is accessory to the dwelling, by one or more residents of the dwelling, and,
- (c) Does not include <u>uses</u> such as an auto repair or paint shop or furniture stripping.

Home Industry (ORM) means an industry:

(a) That is carried out in a <u>dwelling unit</u> or, in a <u>building</u> that is accessory to a <u>dwelling unit</u> or, if the <u>dwelling unit</u> is located on a farm, accessory to the agricultural operation;

- (b) If the **dwelling unit** is not located on a farm:
 - (i) Is carried on as a small-scale <u>use</u> that is secondary to the <u>principal use</u> of the <u>dwelling unit</u> as a <u>detached dwelling</u>;
 - (ii) Provides a service such as carpentry, metalworking, welding, electrical work or blacksmithing, primarily to the farming community; and,
 - (iii) Does not include <u>uses</u> such as <u>motor vehicle</u> repair or paint shop or furniture stripping; and,
- (c) If the **dwelling unit** is located on a farm:
 - (i) Is carried on as a small-scale <u>use</u> that is secondary to the <u>principal use</u> of the farm as an agricultural operation; and,
 - (ii) May include, but is not limited to, a sawmill, welding or woodworking shop, manufacturing or fabrication shop, equipment repair and seasonal storage of <u>recreational</u> motor vehicles;

Home Occupation (ORM) means an occupation that is carried out on a farm that:

- (a) Involves providing personal or professional services such as those offered at or by a; business office, bookkeeper, land surveyor, art studio, hairdresser, massage establishment, home child care, veterinary clinic, or kennel; and,
- (b) Is carried on as a small-scale secondary <u>use</u> within a <u>detached</u> <u>dwelling (ORM)</u> on the farm.

Low Intensity Recreational Use (ORM) means recreational uses that have minimal impact on the natural environment, and requires little terrain or vegetation modification and few, if any, buildings or structures. Low intensity recreational uses (ORM) include, but are not limited to, the following:

- a) Non-motorized trail <u>uses</u>;
- b) Natural Heritage appreciation;
- c) Unserviced camping on public land; and,
- d) Accessory uses.

Low intensity recreational uses (ORM) shall not include a golf course.

<u>Detached Dwelling (ORM)</u> means a <u>building</u> containing only one <u>dwelling</u> <u>unit</u> and, in any area other than an area within a Natural Linkage Area, includes a <u>building</u> containing one primary <u>dwelling unit</u> and no more than one additional <u>dwelling unit</u>.

17.3 GENERAL PROVISIONS

- a) Nothing in this By-law applies to prevent the <u>use</u> of any land, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> for a purpose prohibited in this By-law, if the land, <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> was lawfully used for that purpose on November 15, 2001 and continues to be used for that purpose.
- b) Nothing in this By-law applies to prevent the <u>use</u>, erection or location of a <u>detached dwelling (ORM)</u> if the <u>use</u>, erection and location would have been permitted by the applicable zoning by-law on November 15, 2001.
- c) Nothing in this By-law applies to prevent the reconstruction, within the same location and dimensions, of a <u>building</u> or <u>structure</u> that was lawfully in existence on November 15, 2001 that is damaged or destroyed by causes beyond the owner's control.
- d) Notwithstanding any other provision in this By-law, the erection of a <u>building</u> that has a <u>first storey floor area</u> of 500 square metres or more is not permitted.

17.4 SPECIFIC USE PROVISIONS

17.4.1 HOME OCCUPATION (ORM)

Where a <u>home occupation (ORM)</u> is permitted, the <u>home occupation</u> (ORM):

- a) Shall clearly be a secondary <u>use</u> of the <u>lot</u>;
- Shall be conducted entirely within a <u>dwelling unit</u> in the <u>main</u> <u>building</u> on the <u>lot</u>;
- c) Shall be conducted by at least one of the residents of a <u>dwelling unit</u> located on the same <u>lot</u>;

- d) Shall not employ more than one person who does not reside in the dwelling unit;
- e) Shall not occupy more than 25% of the <u>gross floor area</u> (not including the <u>private garage</u> or the <u>basement</u>) of the <u>dwelling unit</u>, if the <u>home occupation (ORM)</u> provides a service that the general public can access;
- f) Shall, if involving tutoring, not be occupied by more than four students at any one time;
- g) Shall not involve the <u>accessory outdoor storage</u> or outdoor display of materials or finished products;
- Shall not consist of an occupation that involves the sale of a commodity not produced on the <u>premises</u>, unless the items being sold are related to the primary business of the <u>home occupation</u> (ORM); and,
- i) Shall not include the following <u>uses</u>:
 - (i) Any other <u>use</u> defined in this By-law;
 - (ii) Any <u>use</u> requiring ventilation, other than ventilation typically found in any residence;
 - (iii) Any <u>use</u> involving the sale of prepared food for human consumption;
 - (iv) Medical offices, unless the lot has a front lot line or an exterior side lot line that abuts a provincial highway, an arterial road or a major collector road as shown on Maps 10 or 11 of the Official Plan;
 - (v) Any <u>use</u> involving the storage, repair, maintenance, painting and, or, towing of <u>motor vehicles</u> or <u>commercial motor vehicles</u>;
 - (vi) Any <u>use</u> involving furniture stripping;
 - (vii) Dating/escort services; and,
 - (viii) Taxi and limousine service depot/dispatch establishments.

17.4.2 HOME BUSINESS (ORM)

Where a home business (ORM) is permitted, the home business (ORM):

a) Shall clearly be a secondary <u>use</u> of the <u>lot</u>;

- b) Shall be conducted entirely within a <u>dwelling unit</u> in the <u>main</u> <u>building</u> on the <u>lot</u> or within an <u>accessory building or structure</u>;
- c) Shall be conducted by at least one of the residents of a <u>dwelling unit</u> located on the same <u>lot</u>;
- d) Shall not employ more than one person who does not reside in the dwelling unit;
- f) Shall, if involving tutoring, not be occupied by more than four students at any one time;
- g) Shall not involve the <u>outdoor storage</u> or outdoor display of materials or finished products;
- h) Shall not consist of an business that involves the sale of a commodity not produced on the <u>premises</u>, unless the items being sold are related to the primary business of the <u>home business</u> (ORM); and,
- i) Shall not include the following <u>uses</u>:
 - (i) Any other <u>use</u> defined in this By-law;
 - (ii) Any <u>use</u> requiring ventilation, other than ventilation typically found in any residence;
 - (iii) Any <u>use</u> involving the sale of prepared food for human consumption;
 - (iv) Medical offices, unless the lot has a front lot line or an exterior side lot line that abuts a provincial highway, an arterial road or a major collector road as shown on Maps 10 or 11 of the Official Plan;
 - (v) Any <u>use</u> involving the treatment, care and, or, grooming of any animal;
 - (vi) Any <u>use</u> involving the storage, repair, maintenance, painting and, or, towing of <u>motor vehicles</u> or special vehicles;
 - (vii) Any <u>use</u> involving furniture stripping;
 - (viii) Dating/escort services; and
 - (ix) Taxi and limousine service depot/dispatch establishments.

17.5 ADDITIONAL GENERAL PROVISIONS

The provisions of this Section apply in addition to all relevant general provisions in Part 4.0 of this By-law.

17.5.1 GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR ACCESSORY BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES

No <u>accessory building or structure</u> shall:

- a) Be erected on a <u>lot</u> prior to the erection of the <u>main building</u> on the <u>lot</u>;
- b) Be used for human habitation unless expressly permitted by this By-law;
- c) Be located within a public easement; and,
- d) Be located within a <u>front yard</u>, unless expressly permitted by this By-law.

17.5.2 SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR SMALL ACCESSORY BUILDINGS

Small <u>accessory buildings or structures</u>, which do not include detached <u>private garages</u>, are subject to the following provisions:

- a) The maximum permitted gross floor area per accessory building or structure is:
 - (i) 20.0 square metres if the <u>lot area</u> is greater than 1,000 square metres and less than 4,000 square metres; or,
 - (ii) 50.0 square metres if the <u>lot area</u> is 4,000 square metres or greater.
- b) The maximum <u>height</u> per <u>accessory building or structure</u> is:
 - (i) 4.5 metres if the <u>lot area</u> is greater than 1,000 square metres and less than 4,000 square metres; or,
 - (ii) 5.5 metres if the <u>lot area</u> is 4,000 square metres or greater.

- c) The maximum number of permitted <u>accessory buildings or</u> <u>structures</u> on a <u>lot</u> is:
 - (i) 2 including a detached <u>private garage</u> if the <u>lot area</u> is greater than 1,000 square metres and less than 4,000 square metres; or,
 - (ii) 4 if the lot area is 4,000 square metres or greater.
- d) The minimum <u>setback</u> for an <u>accessory building or structure</u> from the <u>interior side lot line</u> and <u>rear lot line</u> is:
 - (i) 1.2 metres from the <u>lot line</u>, which can be reduced to 0.5 metres if there are no doors or windows on the wall facing the <u>lot line</u> if the <u>lot area</u> is greater than 1,000 square metres and less than 4,000 square metres; or,
 - (ii) 1.2 metres if the <u>lot area</u> is 4,000 square metres or greater.
- e) The minimum <u>setback</u> for an <u>accessory building or structure</u> from the <u>exterior side lot line</u> shall be no less than the <u>setback</u> between the <u>main building</u> and the <u>exterior side lot line</u> on any sized <u>lot</u>.

17.5.3 DETACHED PRIVATE GARAGES

One detached <u>private garage</u> is permitted in accordance with the following provisions:

- a) The <u>height</u> of a detached <u>private garage</u> shall be no greater than 4.5 metres.
- b) The detached <u>private garage</u> shall be set back a minimum of:
 - (i) 1.2 metres from the <u>rear lot line</u>;
 - (ii) The <u>setback</u> required for the <u>main building</u> from the exterior side lot line; and,
 - (iii) 1.2 metres from the <u>interior side lot line</u> which can be reduced to 0.5 metres if there are no doors or windows on the wall facing the <u>interior side lot line</u>.
