NOTICE Intention to Designate a Property / Ontario Heritage Act

The Council of the City of Markham intends to designate the following property for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990*, Chapter O.18, Part IV:

John and Sarah Hagerman House 4272 Fourteenth Avenue Markham. ON

The John and Sarah Hagerman House has design and physical value as an early representative example of an Ontario Classic farmhouse designed to serve the needs of a household of modest means. It has a restrained design without ornament. The John and Sarah Hagerman House has historical value for its association with the early cultural and religious diversity of Markham Township, namely the Markham's Berczy Settler community, and more specifically for its association with John Hagerman. He was a member of a locally important Berczy Settler family after whom the historic crossroads community of Hagerman's Corners takes its name. Further, the property has contextual value as one of several nineteenth century buildings that are now embedded within suburban-style development in the vicinity of the historic crossroads community of Hagerman's Corners.
