**Intention to Designate a Property / Ontario Heritage Act**

The Council of the City of Markham intends to designate the following property for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990*, Chapter O.18, Part IV:

Graham-Hallman House  
5474 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue  
Markham, ON

The Graham-Hallman House has design and physical value as an exceptional example of mid-nineteenth century fieldstone construction within the Markham context, displaying a remarkable material quality and high degree of craftsmanship that set it apart from local examples of Georgian architecture. The Graham-Hallman House has historical and associative value representing the theme of immigration, particularly the significant wave of British families who came to Markham Township from 1830 onwards, while also possessing contextual value as one of a number of nineteenth century farmhouses that help to define, maintain and support the historic agricultural character of Dickson Hill community.
