**Intention to Designate a Property / Ontario Heritage Act**

The Council of the City of Markham intends to designate the following property for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990*, Chapter O.18, Part IV:

Albert and Bertha Reesor House  
7880 Highway 7 East  
Markham, ON

The Albert and Bertha Reesor House has design and physical value as a representative example of a village dwelling in the form of an American Foursquare with Edwardian Classical details. The Albert and Bertha Reesor House has historical and associative value as it representative of the early twentieth century development of Locust Hill, and specifically the creation of building lots on farms intended for the use of family members. Further, the dwelling has contextual value as it is one of a number of late nineteenth and early twentieth century buildings that are important in defining, maintaining and supporting the character and extent of the historic hamlet of Locust Hill.
