NOTICE Intention to Designate a Property / Ontario Heritage Act

The Council of the City of Markham intends to designate the following property for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990*, Chapter O.18, Part IV:

John and Christina Ramer House 99 Dickson Hill Road Markham, ON

The John and Christiana Ramer House has design and physical value as a unique example of a vernacular rural dwelling with a balanced, symmetrical form. It displays elements of the Georgian architectural tradition, embellished with elements of the Queen Anne Revival style, in particular an unusual clipped or jerkinhead gable treatment. The John and Christina Ramer House has historical and associative value, making legible the nineteenth century layer of development within the hamlet of Dickson Hill, and specifically the creation of building lots on farms intended for the use of family members. Further, the property has contextual value as one of a number of nineteenth and early twentieth century buildings that define the character and extent of the historic hamlet of Dickson Hill.
